WCMA Cheers Legislative Cheese Champions

Just ahead of June Dairy Month, WCMA last week presented six federal and state lawmakers with its second annual Cheese Champion awards for their efforts to support and advance the dairy processing industry.

Among those recognized at WCMA's Annual Member Meeting was <u>U.S. Senator Tammy</u> <u>Baldwin</u> (D-Wisconsin). Sen. Baldwin is a longtime champion for key WCMA priorities including the creation of the Dairy Business Innovation Alliance, the DAIRY PRIDE Act and CURD Act to ensure accurate food labeling, and investments in rural infrastructure including roads and broadband. More recently, she co-authored the bipartisan, bicameral Safeguarding American Value-Added Exports (SAVE) Act to protect American food products from unfair trade practices by foreign countries.

WCMA also presented a Cheese Champion award to Wisconsin Governor Tony Evers

for his efforts to boost funding for the state's Dairy Processor Grant program, expand dairy export opportunities, and bring the state-of-the-art Center for Dairy Research project to completion. Evers has also proposed an historic \$750 million investment in broadband expansion over the next decade.



WCMA further commended <u>Senator Joan</u> <u>Ballweg</u> (R-Markesan, pictured with WCMA's Rebekah Sweeney), <u>Representative Tony</u> <u>Kurtz</u> (R-Wonewoc), <u>Senator Howard</u> <u>Marklein</u> (R-Spring Green), and <u>Representative Travis Tranel</u> (R-Cuba City) for their strong support for the dairy processing industry.

As members of the legislature's budget-writing Joint Finance Committee, Sen. Ballweg and Rep. Kurtz have led the charge for continued funding of the \$5 million Wisconsin Initiative for Agricultural Exports, which helped boost the state's dairy exports by 37 percent in its first year alone. Both legislators also worked to raise available Dairy Processor Grant dollars to \$1 million over the upcoming biennium.

As co-chair of the Joint Finance Committee, Sen. Marklein has played a critical role in the continued success of the Dairy Innovation Hub, harnessing cutting-edge dairy research at three University of Wisconsin campuses. He has authored legislation to require that all products being sold as milk or cheese be made from real dairy, and led efforts to expand rural broadband access. Sen. Marklein is a lead author of the Agricultural Road Improvement Program (ARIP), a bill devoting \$150 million to fix aging roads in Wisconsin's rural communities. ARIP was recently introduced in partnership with Rep. Tranel, a dairy farmer who now serves Wisconsin dairy farmers and processors as Chair of the Assembly Agriculture Committee.

DBIA Delivers: Pasture Pride Cheese

Since the creation of the <u>Dairy Business Innovation Alliance</u> in the 2018 Farm Bill, WCMA and the Center for Dairy Research have partnered to administer approximately \$7 million in grants to 88 dairy farms and processors. The Alliance now serves an 11-state region including Illinois, Iowa, Indiana, Kansas, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, Ohio, South Dakota, and Wisconsin.

WCMA's social media series, DBIA Delivers, highlights the successes of dairy entrepreneurs that have taken their businesses to the next level thanks to DBIA grants.

Next in the weekly series is <u>Pasture Pride Cheese</u>. Using milk from local Amish dairies in southwestern Wisconsin, Pasture Pride crafts a variety of cheeses, including Juusto cheese, the company's own trademarked Scandinavian style cheese. In 2021, Pasture Pride received a Dairy Business Builder grant to assist with production of a High Kosher Juusto cheese.
