WCMA, CDR Testifies on DBIA at U.S. Senate Agricultural Appropriations Committee Hearing

WCMA and our partners at the Center for Dairy Research (CDR) testified Thursday before the <u>Senate Agricultural Appropriations Committee</u> on our efforts to support on-farm diversification and increased production of value-added dairy products via the <u>Dairy Business Innovation Alliance</u> (DBIA).

Committee Chair Tammy Baldwin (D-Wisconsin) was the driving force behind the creation of the DBIA, and has helped secure ten of millions in U.S. Department of Agriculture funding, maximizing its positive impact on farmers and cheesemakers. DBIA delivers technical assistance, market research, as well as grants to dairy farms and businesses in Illinois, Iowa, Minnesota, South Dakota and Wisconsin.

USTR Issues Special Report Affirming Focus on Fight Against Dairy Gls Limiting Market Access

The Office of the U.S. Trade Representative (USTR) this week issued its **2021 Special 301 Report**, detailing areas of priority focus in international agreements. As noted in pages 24-27, the report affirmed the Biden Administration will continue to fight geographic indicators (GI) pushed by the EU, limiting the use of certain product names, such as fontina, gorgonzola, parmesan, asiago, or feta which stand to undercut American dairy processors' global market access.

WCMA Pushes for Votes on Labeling Bills

WCMA and a dozen other Wisconsin agricultural advocacy groups joined together last week to push for <u>floor votes</u> on Wisconsin State <u>Assembly Bill 73/Senate Bill 81</u> and <u>Assembly Bill 74/Senate Bill 83</u>, proposals which would prohibit the labeling of food as milk or as a dairy product or ingredient, if the food is not made from the milk of a cow or other hooved mammal.


In a <u>letter to lawmakers</u>, the groups noted the need for greater transparency and clarity for consumers in the marketplace, as well as fairness for dairy farmers and processors who have worked for generations to establish their products' reputations for safety, nutritional quality and enjoyment. The bills would also assure Wisconsin is aligned with existing, but currently unenforced, U.S. Food and Drug Administration regulations.

The Wisconsin State Senate Committee on Agriculture and Tourism advanced the bills with a unanimous vote on February 11, and the Assembly Committee on Agriculture advanced them on April 7. Both bills enjoy strong bipartisan support.

Join in USDA Export System Webinar Today

The U.S. Department of Agriculture is hosting a <u>free webinar</u> today, May 4 at 1 p.m. (CT) detailing its new <u>Agriculture Trade Licensing & Attestation Solution (ATLAS) system</u> which will replace the current electronic trade certification system (eTDE), effective May 6.

USDA officials bill ATLAS as a "single enterprise-wide portal that allows the secure exchange of trade data and documents needed for shipments to worldwide ports from marketing through delivery for the dairy industry" and has posted and <u>ATLAS user guide</u> online with complete information.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) will host the Food Loss and Waste Innovation Fair on Wednesday, May 26 from 11 a.m.-3 p.m. (CT). USDA Awards Cheese, Butter, Yogurt Contracts

This week, the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) has awarded two contracts for dairy product purchases:

- \$3.7 million in <u>string cheese contracts</u> were awarded to Miceli Dairy Products Company. Deliveries will be made through September 30, 2021.
- Nearly \$1 million in <u>butter and yogurt contracts</u> were awarded to Byrne Dairy Inc., Chobani, LLC, Select Milk Producers, Inc. and West Point Dairy Products, LLC. Deliveries will be made through September 30, 2021.


Master Cheesemaker Applications Due May 15

An eligible applicant must be an active, licensed Wisconsin cheesemaker for at least 10 consecutive years and have completed the Advanced Cheese Technology Short Course and an additional CDR short course. Applications are available for both new and returning Masters.

U.S. Daily Vaccination Rates Drop Dramatically, Feds Cite Both Hesitancy and Rollout Success

Fewer than 1.1 million Americans are now receiving a first COVID-19 vaccination dose each day, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) reported this week, noting it is the the lowest average since the end of February. As recently as three weeks ago nearly 2 million Americans were getting their first dose each day.

Federal officials attributed the slowdown to vaccine hesitancy, and have urged states to transition to a no-appointment, walk-up model for vaccination centers, for ease of access. They also noted that nearly 40 percent of U.S. adults - 100 million people - are fully vaccinated, and more than 50 percent of U.S. adults have now received at least one dose of a COVID-19 vaccine.


