WCMA President-Elect Bechel Represents Dairy Processing Industry at Biden Stop in La Crosse

President Joe Biden visited Wisconsin earlier today, stopping in La Crosse to tout his newly-struck, bipartisan \$1.2 billion infrastructure deal, which includes \$579 billion in new spending on roads, bridges, railways, public transit, electric vehicle systems, power, broadband and water.

WCMA President-Elect Steve Bechel of Eau Galle Cheese represented the dairy processing industry at the event, following an invitation facilitated by U.S. Senator Tammy Baldwin (D-Wisconsin).



WCMA members have identified rural broadband improvements as a key policy priority, and applaud bipartisan efforts to invest in rural infrastructure.



Senate Leaders Expect Action on WCMA-Backed

Truth-in-Labeling Bills This Fall

Wisconsin State Senate leaders this week said they expect action on WCMA-backed bills designed to protect consumers from misleading product labels this coming fall, following an impactful advocacy push from WCMA members.

Assembly Bill 73/Senate Bill 81 and Assembly 74/Senate Bill 83 would prohibit the labeling of food as milk or as a dairy product or ingredient, if the food is not made from the milk of a cow or other hooved mammal. The bills would bring Wisconsin in line with existing but currently unenforced U.S. Food and Drug Administration regulations defining these products. The bills were unanimously approved in the Wisconsin State Assembly last week, and Governor Tony Evers has said he will sign them into law.

Wisconsin Budget Advancing This Week, Includes Key Provisions for Dairy Processors

Floor debate over Wisconsin's state budget begins today with final votes to approve the \$87 billion package designed by Republican lawmakers expected Wednesday night.

Agriculture emerged as a bipartisan priority in the budget process, with the proposal currently before lawmakers including these WCMA-backed initiatives:

- \$5 million over the next five years for a new agricultural exports program, with half of all allocated funds earmarked to support increased dairy sales abroad
- A boost of \$200,000 per year for dairy processors grants, bringing total annual funds for the program to \$400,000
- Sustained funding for the Dairy Innovation Hub
- Sustained funding for the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection
- \$125 million to expand rural broadband access

Following legislative passage, Gov. Evers has broad power to sign the package into law, to line-item veto parts of it, or to veto it in its entirety, which he had threatened prior to Republicans amending their plan to boost support for public education.

WCMA will continue to keep members informed of relevant budget developments.

Dairy Not Among Industries Targeted for Wisconsin PFAS Regulations

Wisconsin's Department of Natural Resources (WDNR) is moving forward with a proposed rule to regulate PFAS - poly- and perfluoroalkyl substances - by setting surface water quality limits for these chemicals in waste streams from industries and municipalities. A proposed rule and economic impact analysis will be released in July.

At a briefing with WPDES permit holders and associations, WDNR spokespersons noted a

strategy of numeric limits, follow by two years of permit-holder testing, to learn if waste streams exceed proposed limits. A PFAS minimization plan, implemented over seven years, would follow for companies or municipalities over the proposed limits.

It is important to note that dairy and food manufacturers were not listed at the WDNR briefing among industries likely to face PFAS minimization efforts. These substances, used to make firefighting foam, nonstick coatings and some food packaging materials, are more likely to be found in paper manufacturing, metal finishing, power plants, commercials laundries and other nonfood permitted sites, the WDNR stated.

The proposed rules will move to public hearings in the fall of 2021.

Minnesota Bill to Ban PFAS in Food Packaging, Lift Manure Spreading Restrictions

Minnesota lawmakers approved a <u>\$224 million compromise package of environmental provisions</u> last week, including a ban on poly- and perfluoroalkyl substances, or PFAS, and lift state restrictions on a ban on manure spreading in October.

The PFAS ban, which would <u>take effect in 2024</u>, specifically prohibits any chemicals "intentionally added" to food packaging, not PFAS that may unintentionally land on packaging from nonstick sprays commonly used on manufacturing equipment. The bill also funds a study to determine which food products contain PFAS.

The package also prohibits state regulators from <u>restricting the application of manure</u> to farm fields in October, a provision that may be challenged by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.

The deal, negotiated by Senate Republicans and House Democrats, now awaits signing by Governor Tim Walz.

The LaGrander system features pretreatment of wastewater, aerobic digestion with enhanced bio P removal, and membrane filtration of the effluent for final discharge in the North Fork of the Eau Claire River.

Apply Now for DBIA "Industry Impact" Grants of Up to \$250,000 Per Award

DBIA recently launched its \$1 million Industry Impact grant campaign and is accepting applications now for individual awards ranging from \$50,000 to \$250,000.

Successful applications will focus on projects designed to to create new revenue streams, develop uses for dairy ingredients/products, or solve broad challenges for the dairy industry. Project examples are provided in a "Helpful Hints" document available online.



Matching funds are not required but welcome. Applicants do not have to be dairy processors but must collaborate with a dairy business on the project in order to demonstrate industry interest and resource capabilities. Dairy processor applicants must be located or have plants/locations within the DBIA five-state region of Illinois, Iowa, Minnesota, South Dakota and Wisconsin. DBIA is requesting applicants' project abstracts by July 15, with full proposals due in September.



WCMA member company Weyauwega Star Dairy unofficially broke its own record for the world's longest piece of string cheese at 3,832 feet - or three-quarters of a mile - on Thursday, June 24. The string cheese equaled about 30,000 individual sticks. Gerard Knaus' father, Jim, set the original record in 1995, and Gerard says the new record, if recognized by the Guinness Book of World Records, will remain in Jim's name. Evers Has Until July 6 to Weigh Bill to End Wisconsin Unemployment Booster

On Wednesday, June 23, Wisconsin <u>lawmakers formally presented</u> Governor Tony Evers with Assembly Bill 336, legislation to end the state's participation in a federal unemployment enhancement program offering an additional \$300 per week to jobless Wisconsinites. Their action began the clock on Evers' consideration of the bill; by law, he has 10 days (excepting Sundays) to take action. WCMA and other business advocacy groups have lobbied for Evers' approval, though he has indicated he is likely to veto it.

Federal unemployment booster payments are otherwise set to end on September 6. Twenty-five states have approved an early end to the offerings, citing workforce shortages.

WCMA's Fall/Winter 2021 leadership trainings are filling quickly, and we encourage you to register now to join us!

WCMA <u>Front-Line Leadership Training</u> returns in September with hybrid offerings, allowing students to join classes in person in Madison, Wisconsin, or online from anywhere in the world. The courses in this training track can be taken à la carte and in any order.

- Part A, focused on exploring the essential skills to own your role as a supervisor, will be held September 7.
- Part B centers on positively impacting staff performance, and will be held on October 4.
- Part C breaks down the key ingredients for cultivating a team, and will be held on November 8.

Tuition is \$135 and includes materials and instruction, as well as lunch for those attending in person. Enrollment is limited to 22 individuals per class.



This series also features guest speakers from industry detailing their leadership successes and challenges, and requires participants to complete real-world projects that implement their new knowledge.
