# House Agriculture Committee Approves \$43B in Rural Broadband Investments

Last week, the U.S. House of Representatives' Agriculture Committee unanimously approved HR 4374, also known as the <u>Broadband Internet Connections for Rural America Act</u>. The bill provides \$43 billion over eight years to bring broadband service to businesses and families in rural areas and support pilot projects to test new technologies. The proposal now moves to the U.S. Senate for approval.

WCMA members have identified broadband expansion as a policy priorities, and WCMA continues to advocate at the federal and state level for investments in high-speed internet access for all.

### **Evers Directs \$130M to Workforce Initiatives**

Wisconsin Governor Tony Evers announced last week he is <u>directing \$130 million</u> of Wisconsin's federal COVID-19 relief funds to help address workforce challenges in the state. The funding will go toward a variety of initiatives, including a \$100 million Workforce Innovation grant program to help regions and communities develop solutions to their local workforce issues. The investment will also support worker advancement efforts such as skills training with local employers, as well as career coaching for people who are attempting to return to the workforce.

WCMA will keep members informed of opportunities to make use of these new funds to support their own efforts to attract, retain and train their workforce.

# WCMA *Instant Data* Survey Offers Insights on Signing Bonuses, Shift Differentials

Thanks go to the 40 WCMA dairy manufacturing members who participated in our latest *Instant Data Survey*, conducted last week, which gathered information on industry practices related to signing bonuses and shift-based wage differentials. Their responses represent policies in place for more than 19,000 employees nationwide.

While participants received a complete report of data collected via email, WCMA is pleased to share with all members that 38 percent of respondent members report they are currently offering a signing bonus for new employees. We can also share broadly that 70 percent of respondent members offer different wages, based on the shifts worked by employees.

Register now to join the Dairy Food Safety Alliance on Thursday, September 9 from 11 a.m.-3 p.m. (CT) for practical presentations on the latest in food safety research and regulatory practices, and a chance to reconnect with your peers in dairy processing. The Alliance, a partnership between the Center for Dairy Research (CDR), Dairy Farmers of Wisconsin (DFW) and WCMA, will offer registrants two ways to participate: live, in-person at the Holiday Inn-Madison at the American Center in Madison, Wisconsin or via a video conferencing link.

The Dairy Food Safety Alliance meeting on September 9 will feature speakers from state and federal regulatory agencies, along with industry experts. A complete agenda will be offered in August, with presentations detailing ongoing food safety research projects, including a study on the use of hydrogen peroxide in brine, opportunities for timer-sealer certification in Wisconsin, the new federal Food Safety Blueprint, and updated Preventive Controls guidance and resources.

## **DBIA Grant Abstracts Due Friday**

The Dairy Business Innovation Alliance has extended the deadline to submit abstracts for Industry Impact grants by one week to this coming Friday, July 23. DBIA plans to distribute a total of \$1 million in this grant cycle, which individual award values for between \$50,000 and \$250,000.

Successful applications will focus on projects designed to create new revenue streams, develop uses for dairy ingredients/products, or solve broad challenges for the dairy industry. Matching funds are not required but welcome. Applicants do not have to be dairy processors but must collaborate with a dairy business on the project in order to demonstrate industry interest and resource capabilities. Dairy processor applicants must be located or have plants/locations within the DBIA five-state region of Illinois, Iowa, Minnesota, South Dakota and Wisconsin.

WCMA's upcoming leadership trainings are filling quickly, and we encourage you to

#### register now to join us!

WCMA <u>Front-Line Leadership Training</u> returns in September with hybrid offerings, allowing students to join classes in person in Madison, Wisconsin, or online from anywhere in the world. The courses in this training track can be taken à la carte and in any order.

- Part A, focused on exploring the essential skills to own your role as a supervisor, will be held September 7.
- Part B centers on positively impacting staff performance, and will be held on October 4.
- Part C breaks down the key ingredients for cultivating a team, and will be held on November 8.

Tuition is \$135 and includes materials and instruction, as well as lunch for those attending in person. Enrollment is limited to 22 individuals per class, and just 5 spaces remain available.

The <u>WCMA Advanced Leadership Series</u> will also be offered to students in a hybrid format, allowing them to join in three sessions either in Madison, Wisconsin, or online. Those enrolling participate in the entire series as a cohort to better facilitate relationships.
