# Senate Advances Bill Boosting USDA, FDA Funding

The Senate Appropriations Committee on Wednesday advanced a \$25.8 billion bill to fund the U.S. Department of Agriculture and the Food and Drug Administration for Fiscal Year 2022. The amount is slightly less than the \$26.55 billion approved by the House in late July, but still \$2.5 billion more than previous funding levels. Differences between the bills are likely to be worked out in a full package of spending bills later this year. Additional aid is intended to support USDA's efforts to address climate change, additional research programs, and disaster aid.

Agriculture, Rural Development, and Food and Drug Administration Appropriations Subcommittee Chair Tammy Baldwin (D-Wisconsin) called the Senate measure a "responsible and thoughtful bill" and praised additional funding for the Dairy Business Innovation Initiatives, a policy priority for WCMA members. The bill also provides full funding for nutrition programs to serve the estimated need for FY22. The bill also includes \$6.278 billion in discretionary funding for the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children; an increase of \$7 million for the Commodity Supplemental Food Program; and an increase of \$10 million for the Emergency Food Assistance Program. It provides \$700 million for the ReConnect Broadband Pilot, expanding rural access to high speed internet, and 1.5 billion in grants and loans for rural business and industry programs that promote small business growth in rural areas.

## USDA Solicits Bids for Butter, String Cheese, Cheddar, and Swiss; Awards Contracts to WCMA Members

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) has issued solicitations for butter and a variety of cheeses to be used in the federal school lunch program and other nutrition assistance programs:

- Butter bids are due August 12 by 9:00 a.m. (CT)
- String cheese bids are due August 18 by 2:00 p.m. (CT)
- Cheddar and Swiss bids are due August 19 by 1:00 p.m. (CT)

USDA also recently agreed to purchase <u>over 330,000 pounds of mozzarella</u> from WCMA member Saputo Dairy USA and <u>nearly 75,000 pounds of Cheddar</u> from WCMA member Great Lakes Cheese. We congratulate both companies and applaud our members' commitment to providing fresh, nutritious dairy products to consumers nationwide.

# WDATCP Seeking Nominations for Organic Advisory Council

The Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (WDATCP) is <a href="accepting nominations">accepting nominations</a> for the Organic Advisory Council until September 17, 2021. # WDATCP Clarifies Handling Process for Direct Milk Shipments Rejected for Drug Residue

The Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (WDATCP) has clarified when and where a clearing sample can be collected from a direct ship milk tanker after a confirmed positive drug residue test. For dairy plants, direct loads that are to be tested as a clearing sample must be shipped no more than 24 hours after the initial confirmed positive result. These samples may be offered for sale when the samples test negative. If a load is shipped after the 24-hour period and tests positive, it will be considered a second violation by WDATCP.


## Wisconsin State Fair to Host Blue Ribbon Dairy Products Auction

### **Most of the Country Now Advised to Mask**

More than 90 percent of all U.S. counties now have "high" (areas marked in red) or "substantial" (areas marked in orange) community transmission of COVID-19, meaning that individuals living and working in those areas are advised by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention to wear face masks, regardless of their vaccination status. The CDC's revised masking guidance was released last week, following new studies showing that vaccinated individuals who are infected can carry the same viral load as those who are unvaccinated.

# More U.S. Employers Mandate Vaccination Amid COVID-19 Surge

With the daily average of new COVID-19 cases in the United States now topping 100,000, the highest level since February, more nationwide businesses have announced vaccine requirements for their employees. In the past week, United Airlines, Frontier Airlines, Google, Microsoft, Disney, Netflix, Facebook, and Tyson Foods announced they will require their staff to provide proof of COVID-19 vaccination. The 1.3 million active-duty members of the U.S. military will also be required to get the COVID-19 vaccine beginning next month under a plan laid out by the Pentagon yesterday. Other companies,

including Walmart and Walgreens, are requiring vaccinations for their office staff, but exempting front-line staff from mandates.

The U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission has <u>stated that it is legal</u> under federal law for companies to require their workers to get the COVID-19 vaccine, with exceptions related to other health complications and religious beliefs.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, <u>71.1 percent of American</u> <u>adults</u> or 58.8 percent of all Americans have received at least one dose of the COVID-19 vaccine.

Register now to join the Dairy Food Safety Alliance on Thursday, September 9 from 11 a.m.-3 p.m. (CT) for practical presentations on the latest in food safety research and regulatory practices, and a chance to reconnect with your peers in dairy processing. The Alliance, a partnership between the Center for Dairy Research (CDR), Dairy Farmers of Wisconsin (DFW) and WCMA, will offer registrants two ways to participate: live, in-person at the Holiday Inn-Madison at the American Center in Madison, Wisconsin or via a video conferencing link.

The meeting will feature speakers from state and federal regulatory agencies, along with industry experts. 
