Join WCMA Webinar Today on OSHA's Revised COVID-19 Employer Guidance

Register now to take part in a free COVID-19 webinar available exclusively to WCMA members today, Tuesday, September 14 from 1:00-1:45 p.m. (CT). The webinar will focus on newly-revised COVID-19 guidance for employers issued by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA).

Wisconsin State Laboratory of Hygiene (WSLH) Industrial Hygiene Consultant-Engineer George Gruetzmacher, PhD, CIH, CSP, PE and Environmental Health Specialist Kelli Rush will join WCMA staff for this presentation, detailing what dairy processors can expect if they are inspected by OSHA in relation to their COVID-19 protocols. Rush will also detail the free services offered to Wisconsin employers by the WSLH WisCon COVID-19 Consultations program.

WCMA will reserve time at the end of the webinar for WSLH staff to answer member questions on any COVID-19 related topic, with WCMA staff presenting pre-submitted questions anonymously.

Biden Orders OSHA Rule Mandating Employers of 100+ Require COVID-19 Vaccination or Testing

As COVID-19 infections, hospitalizations, and deaths continue to rise due to the Delta variant, President Joe Biden last Thursday ordered the Occupational Health and Safety Administration (OSHA) to immediately draft a rule mandating that all American employers with more than 100 workers require their workforce to be fully vaccinated or tested for COVID-19 on at least a weekly basis. These employers will also be required to give workers paid time off to get vaccinated. The measure is expected to impact 80 million Americans, or two thirds of the U.S. workforce, though complete details of the plan have not yet been released.

President Biden on Thursday also announced:

- All federal employees, federal contractors, and workers at health facilities that receive federal Medicare or Medicaid dollars must be fully vaccinated. These mandates are expected to impact an additional 20 million American workers.
- The federal government will work to increase the supply of COVID-19 testing supplies, and has secured concessions from retailers, including Walmart, Amazon and Kroger, to sell testing kits at cost beginning this week.
- Federal fines for those who refuse to wear masks on flights and on federal property will be doubled.
- Additional federal support will be sent to schools to support safe operations and increased COVID-19 testing.

USDA Opens Additional Meeting Slots for Participants in New Pandemic Aid Program

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) has opened <u>additional time slots</u> to meet one-on-one with cooperatives and handlers that are eligible for the agency's Pandemic Market Volatility Assistance Program (PMVAP). When selecting a meeting slot, please enter your company or cooperative name and associated milk marketing order in the Postal Address field.

BOOK YOUR MEETING

Announced on August 19, the <u>PMVAP will provide</u> more than \$350 million in payments to dairy farms nationwide that have been impacted by pandemic-related market disruptions. USDA will work with milk buyers to determine the amount owed to producers and distribute the payments. Additionally, WCMA will work with University of Wisconsin-Madison Director of Dairy Policy Dr. Mark Stephenson to supply content for the producer education component of the program.

Dairy Farmers of Wisconsin Training Spotlight: SQF Quality Systems for Manufacturing


WCMA partner Dairy Farmers of Wisconsin (DFW) is accepting registrations for its SQF
