Vaccination Order Details for Federal Contractors Coming This Week

Federal contractors can expect complete details on new COVID-19 vaccination
requirements
for their employees by this Friday, September 24. The Biden administration's Safer Federal Workforce Task Force
is expected to release definitions, explanations of vaccination protocols and deadlines, as well as a list of possible exceptions and exemptions to the orders.

Apply Beginning Sept. 23 for USDA Pandemic Response and Safety Grants

Prepare now to apply for <u>Pandemic Safety and Response Grants</u> through the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) beginning Thursday, September 23. The program aims to help food processors, manufacturers, distributors, and others in the food supply chain recover costs incurred by responding to the COVID-19 pandemic, including for measures to protect workers. The minimum funding request amount is \$1,500. The maximum funding request amount is \$20,000. No cost sharing or matching funds are required. Grants will cover activities associated with:

- Workplace Safety: Implementing workplace safety measures to protect against COVID-19
- Market Pivots: Implementing market pivots to protect against COVID–19
- Retrofitting Facilities: Retrofitting facilities for worker and consumer safety to protect against COVID–19
- Transportation: Providing additional transportation options to maintain social distancing and worker and consumer safety to protect against COVID-19
- Worker Housing: Providing worker housing that protects against COVID-19
- Medical: Providing health services to protect workers against COVID-19

FDA Panel Recommends COVID-19 Booster Shots for Older Adults, At-Risk Individuals

On Friday, a Food and Drug Administration (FDA) committee <u>recommended a booster dose</u> for recipients of the Pfizer vaccine who are 65 or older and people who are at high risk of severe COVID-19. Before booster doses can begin, approval must be granted by the FDA and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices. That committee is expected to meet this week.

WCMA Partners with State Lawmakers on Ag Export Funding

WCMA thanks Wisconsin State Representative Tony Kurtz (R-Wonewoc), State Senator Joan Ballweg (R-Markesan), pictured here, and Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection leadership, including Deputy Secretary Angela James, for their collaboration and continued commitment to increasing state support for a new agricultural exports initiative.

In a meeting this week at the State Capitol, the group discussed ways to advance a plan to provide \$5 million over the next five years for

this effort, which has already secured \$1 million in start-up funding via the newly-approved state budget. Half of all funds allocated will support efforts to boost dairy exports from Wisconsin.



WCMA will continue to advocate for this policy priority, and to support the coming launch of the Wisconsin Agricultural Exports Initiative.

WCMA Board Tours Center for Dairy Research Building Project

On Thursday, WCMA's Board of Directors participated in a tour of the <u>Center for Dairy Research (CDR) building project</u> on the University of Wisconsin-Madison campus. Phase one of the project—constructing the three-story Center for Dairy Research (CDR) addition—is nearing the "substantial completion" stage, where

the space can be occupied and used for its intended function. The addition will be ready for CDR occupancy later this year, after which the second phase of the project will begin.



The complete remodel of the Babcock Hall dairy plant, which includes the addition of a new raw room on the south end and new flooring and equipment, and the remodeled office space for CDR are scheduled to be complete in September 2022.

The \$72.6 million project, made possible by support from WCMA members, UW-Madison, and the State of Wisconsin, features new equipment, training space, and research tools that will help CDR support innovation and global competitiveness in the dairy industry.




