USDA to End Food Box Program in May

Speaking at a Congressional hearing on Wednesday, U.S. Department of Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack announced his agency will bring the Farmers to Families Food Box program to an end in May. The \$4 billion Food Box program has delivered more than 156 million boxes of dairy, meat and produce since the start of the pandemic.

USDA <u>staff emphasized</u> to reporters that the program had "significant challenges" noting that box distribution was not based on need; rural counties were underserved; prices fluctuated from \$28 to \$105 per box; food varied in quality and quantity; perishable items often went unrefrigerated; and small businesses struggled to compete for contracts.

Vilsack noted that USDA plans to direct tax dollars to expand food stamp benefits and increase food purchases through existing government food distribution programs.

USDA Details New Dairy Donation Program

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) announced yesterday that it will soon begin the \$400 million Dairy Donation Program (DDP), as established in the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2021.

The DDP is designed to address food insecurity, offset processors' and producers' costs, and minimize food waste through direct reimbursements for processors' donation of dairy products to nonprofit organizations.

In a public notice, USDA detailed the following key program requirements:

- A donation and distribution plan must be submitted and approved by USDA. Appropriate forms for submitting this information will be provided once the regulations are published.
- The reimbursement will be at least equivalent to the minimum classified value of milk used to make the donated product on the date of manufacturing.
- Records related to the donation and receipt of products must be maintained for review and/or audit.
- Eligibility is open to dairy farmer cooperatives and processors who "account to" a federal milk marketing order (FMMO) and donate dairy products to any private or public nonprofit food distribution entity.

USDA officials also emphasized that guiding statute does allow for retroactive reimbursements of donations made before donation and distribution plans are approved. USDA provided advance notice of the minimum program provisions to encourage the dairy industry to process and donate surplus milk supplies as it moves through the spring production season.

Evers Strikes Deal with USDA to Preserve \$70M in FoodShare Funding

Late Tuesday, Wisconsin Governor Tony **Evers announced** he had reached an agreement with the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) to preserve more than \$70 million per month in supplemental food assistance benefits for more than 400,000 Wisconsinites. Negotiations were necessary following the Wisconsin Supreme Court's decision to strike down Evers' emergency order, a requirement for additional federal aid. USDA agreed to accept an **emergency declaration** issued by Wisconsin Department of Health Secretary-designee Karen Timberlake on April 8 as a sufficient substitute.

Wisconsin Court Strikes Down Capacity Limits

The Wisconsin Supreme <u>Court ruled</u> Wednesday that Governor Tony Evers does not have the authority to impose capacity limits on bars and restaurants without legislative approval.

DOL Issues Guidance on COBRA Subsidy

The U.S. Department of Labor has issued <u>guidance</u> and <u>model notices</u> on an American Rescue Plan provision fully subsidizing COBRA premiums for workers who are involuntarily laid off or have reduced hours, April 1 through September 30, 2021. Qualifying individuals will not have to pay premiums or administrative fees for COBRA continuation coverage.
