## Biden Announces Tax Credit for Employers Offering Paid Leave for COVID-19 Vaccination

President Joe Biden on Wednesday announced a <u>tax credit for employers</u> offering vaccine-related paid leave, amid a slight decline in vaccination demand in the past week.

The tax credit, part of the \$1.9 trillion American Rescue Plan Biden signed into law last month, applies to nearly half of all private sector employees. For businesses and nonprofits with fewer than 500 employees, the tax credit will cover paid leave for up to \$511 per day per employee for up to 10 workdays, or 80 work hours, taken between April 1 and Sept. 30, 2021.

The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has released<u>a fact sheet</u> detailing how employers can claim the paid sick leave credit on their quarterly tax filings.

## **USDA Extends School Lunch Regulatory Flexibilities**

Earlier this week, the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) announced an extension of a **broad range of regulatory flexibilities** to allow school meal programs and childcare institutions to continue to provide healthy meals, including dairy products, free of charge to children in fall 2021, as the pandemic continues.

# Bipartisan Congressional Coalition Introduces More Generous PPP Proposal for Farmers

A bipartisan Congressional coalition, led by U.S. Senators Tammy Baldwin (D-Wisconsin), Ben Cardin (D-Maryland) and James Lankford (R-Oklahoma), have introduced legislation to <u>extend more relief</u> to farmers and small businesses. The Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) Flexibility for Farmers, Ranchers, and the Self-Employed Act would change to loan calculations to allow self-employed farmers and ranchers to apply for more generous PPP loans based on their gross income, retroactively.

#### More Than Half of Wisconsin Adults Now Vaccinated

More than <u>half of all Wisconsinites</u> aged 16 and older have now received at least one dose of COVID-19 vaccine, the Wisconsin Department of Health Services (WDHS) reported Wednesday. More than <u>3.9 million doses</u> have been administered in the state, with Pfizer making up for more than half of those doses.
