# Vermont Dairy Producers and Processors Can Apply Now For \$25M in Aid

The \$25 million Vermont COVID-19 Agriculture Assistance Program Dairy Assistance Program is <a href="mailto:now accepting online applications">now accepting online applications</a> from producers and processors. The deadline to apply for aid payments is October 1.

## **USDA Reports \$6.2B in CFAP Relief Distributed**

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) this week reported via its new <u>Coronavirus Food</u>
<u>Assistance Program (CFAP) dashboard</u> that it has processed more than \$6.2 billion in payments to more than 442,000 farmers, directing \$1.2 billion to the dairy industry.

# Wisconsin to Reopen Enrollment for Farm Aid

The Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection has announced it will hold a **second enrollment period** for farmers seeking financial aid during the coronavirus pandemic through the **Wisconsin Farm Support Program**.

Approximately \$50 million in direct financial aid was available at the start of the program, and up to \$10 million remains available for qualifying farmers during the second aid enrollment period, which will run August 10-24.

Farmers who submitted online financial aid applications during the first enrollment period should receive the maximum <u>payments of \$3,500 this week</u>.

## FDA Launches Grade "A" Milk Search System

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) this week launched the <u>Grade "A" Milk Search</u> (<u>GAMS) System</u>, searchable database of the FDA's online Grade "A" Milk Memoranda. It is designed to serve as a resource to state and local milk regulatory and rating agencies, the dairy industry, and other interested parties in the safe production of milk and milk products through the application of science-based food safety principles on the farm and through the processing chain.


# Grant Webinar Available Online; Apply By August 14 for Up to \$20,000 in Business Support



Business Innovation Alliance (DBIA) direct-to-business grant opportunities. Applications are due August 14, and awards will be made in September.

Coordinated in partnership by the Center for Dairy Research (CDR) at the University of Wisconsin-Madison and WCMA, DBIA has \$220,000 to distribute via a competitive grants process in 2020. Dairy farmers and processors in Illinois, Iowa, Minnesota, South Dakota, and Wisconsin may apply for awards of up to \$20,000.
