# Register for USDA Webinar Tomorrow at Noon Detailing Food Box Amendment

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) will host a <u>free webinar</u> on its amendment to the third round of solicitations for the Farmers to Families Food Box program on Wednesday, August 12 at 12 noon (CT). The <u>amendment</u> will allow USDA to accept proposals for dairy-only boxes and for vendors to include hard, semi-firm or semisoft cheeses, in addition to those previously approved. <u>Registration</u> is required.

## WCMA Notes: Demand Remains in Volatile Times

# **USDA Pushes CFAP Deadline to September 11**

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) is **pushing the deadline** to apply for aid via its Coronavirus Food Assistance Program (CFAP) to September 11. USDA officials reported the agency has processed **more than \$7 billion in payments to 521,000 farmers**. The amount directed to dairy farmers - \$1.3 billion - is again virtually unchanged this week.

## SBA Opens PPP Loan Forgiveness Portal, But Banks May Wait to Apply

The U.S. Small Business Administration officially opened the Paycheck Protection Program loan forgiveness portal yesterday, but many banks say they will hold on the paperwork and process. Wells Fargo said in a statement it is waiting on additional guidance from SBA. JPMorgan Chase & Co.

noted its forgiveness process would not begin until late August or early September. Bank of America is "communicating directly with clients with additional instructions on how and when to apply." The two other banks that make up the top five PPP lenders by value – Truist Bank and PNC Bank – will begin accepting forgiveness applications from small businesses later this month.

# Wisconsin Officials Offer Insight on Workforce Challenges Posed by Childcare, School Shifts

Wisconsin's Talent Development Council is sharing a <u>free, recorded webinar</u> focused on how employers can support their staff, as they face limited childcare options and impacts of distance education offerings. The webinar panel includes Wisconsin Department of Workforce Development Secretary Caleb Frostman and key staff from the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction, Wisconsin Department of Children and Families, and Wisconsin Early Childhood Association.

## **DBIA Grant Applications Due Friday, August 14**



Apply by Friday, August 14 for up to \$20,000 in grant monies from the **Dairy Business Innovation Alliance** (DBIA).

Coordinated in partnership by the Center for Dairy Research (CDR) at the University of Wisconsin-Madison and WCMA, DBIA has \$230,000 to distribute via a competitive grants process in 2020. Dairy farmers and processors in Illinois, Iowa, Minnesota, South Dakota, and Wisconsin may apply. Awards will be announced in September.

## Gruyere Deemed "Generic" Cheese Type, as U.S. Rejects Push from French and Swiss

The U.S. Patent and Trademark Office's <u>Trademark Trial and Appeal Board this week rejected a</u> <u>push from French and Swiss gruyere associations</u> to bar American cheesemakers from using the term "gruyere," noting it as a generic style of cheese. The decision is a major win for the Consortium for Common Names, a group WCMA supports and has partnered with to protect member interests.

## **USDA Proposes Rule on Organic Standards**

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) last week **proposed a new rule** to expand the National Organic Program's (NOP) oversight and enforcement of the production, handling and sale of organic products. USDA aims to support organic farmers through the revised regulations, which would standardize organic certificates, increase inspector qualifications, and more. USDA will accept **public comment on the Strengthening Organic Enforcement proposed rule** through October 5.
