CDC: Masks with Exhalation Valves and Vents Do Not Prevent Coronavirus Spread

In <u>newly-updated guidance</u>, the Centers for Disease Prevention and Control (CDC) is warning against the use of masks with exhalation valves and vents. The guidance now notes, "The purpose of masks is to keep respiratory droplets from reaching others to aid with source control. However, masks with one-way valves or vents allow air to be exhaled through a hole in the material, which can result in expelled respiratory droplets that can reach others. This type of mask does not prevent the person wearing the mask from transmitting COVID-19 to others."

SBA Updates PPP Guidance Documents

The U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) has updated guidance documents addressing questions about the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) and Economic Injury Disaster Loans (EIDLs).

The <u>PPP FAQ</u> now notes (in items 50 and 51) that use of a broker or other third party is immaterial to SBA's loan guarantee or payment of lender fees and that payments required for the provision of group health care benefits include vision and dental care. A new <u>PPP loan forgiveness FAQ</u> details the forgiveness process for business owners that received both PPP and EIDL monies.

USDA CFAP Payments Jump to \$9 Billion

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) officials are reporting a <u>jump of nearly \$2 billion in</u> <u>Coronavirus Food Assistance Program (CFAP) payments</u>, which now total \$9 billion. Dairy farmers have received \$1.6 billion in relief. The deadline to apply has been pushed to September 11.

INDUSTRY UPDATES

USDA Solicits Swiss Cheese Contracts, Updates Commodity Requirements with WCMA Input

The U.S. Department of Agriculture today announced plans to purchase nearly 80,000 pounds of Swiss cheese for nutrition assistance programs. A formal solicitation will soon be available electronically through the Web-Based Supply Chain Management system.

Last week, USDA announced <u>new specifications for natural Swiss cheese</u> for use in domestic feeding programs. The changes, which allow for wider acceptable ranges for standards including pH, moisture, and fat levels, reflect WCMA's direct advocacy efforts on behalf of Swiss cheese manufacturer members. Thanks goes to all members who quickly contributed information to WCMA.

WCMA Comments on FDA Ultrafiltered Milk Rule

WCMA continues to advocate for the use of ultrafiltered milk in dairy processing, submitting additional comments last week to the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA). As members may recall, FDA's proposed rule calls for products made with UF milk to be specifically labeled. WCMA is urging FDA amend the definition of milk to include filtered milk, thereby negating a need for the term "ultrafiltered" on products.

House Lawmakers Call for Enforcement of USMCA

A bipartisan coalition of 104 members of the U.S. House of Representatives have <u>sent a letter</u> to U.S. Department of Agriculture Secretary Sonny Perdue and U.S Trade Representative Robert Lighthizer, urging them to hold Mexico and Canada to the terms of the USMCA, specifically calling out the importance of Canada's dairy commitments and Mexico's need to recognize common cheese names. The letter, which follows similar messaging from members of the U.S. Senate last week, was authored by Congressmen Ron Kind (D-WI) and Tom Reed (R-NY), among others.
