Amid Ongoing Congressional Conflict, Senate to Vote on \$500B Coronavirus Relief Package

U.S. Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell (R-KY) today announced the <u>Senate will vote on a</u> <u>pared-back coronavirus relief bill</u> later this week. The \$500 billion package includes \$300-per-week boosts in unemployment benefits through the end of the year, a new round of small business support, \$10 billion for child care, and \$10 billion for the Postal Service.

The <u>legislation is unlikely to advance</u>, as it lacks support in the U.S. House of Representatives, controlled by <u>Democrats who approved a \$3 trillion package</u> in May, which includes \$915 billion in support for state and local units of government and another round of direct stimulus checks for Americans.

WCMA Notes: Retain Your Workforce as Pandemic, Child Care Disruptions Persist

With ten percent of America's workforce currently filing for jobless benefits amid the coronavirus pandemic, it seems strange to say that we have a labor shortage. Yet, between unemployment enhancers and personal health concerns, most dairy industry employers know, good help remains hard to find.

Now, as children head "back to school" virtually and daycare centers



remain shuttered, we may be on the cusp of another labor exodus.

In the <u>September edition of *WCMA Notes*</u>, WCMA Communications, Education, and Policy Director Rebekah Sweeney offers five simple, low-cost ways dairy industry employers can adapt to retain staff as the country faces child care disruptions during the pandemic.

Wisconsin Groundwater Council Recommends Research, Support for Improved Nutrient Management

The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources' Groundwater Coordinating Council last week submitted its <u>2020 report to the Legislature</u>, recommending state support for research on nutrient management practices that minimize the loss of natural soil nitrogen to groundwater, and for a program to help develop and implement those practices on Wisconsin farms.

Dairy Innovation Hub Funds Seven Projects



University of Wisconsin–Madison College of Agricultural and Life Sciences officials have announced seven projects which will receive 2020 grants via the Dairy Innovation Hub initiative. The projects address the Hub's four priorities: stewarding land and water resources; enriching human health and nutrition; ensuring animal health and welfare; and growing farm business and communities.

WCMA has proudly advocated for the Dairy Innovation Hub, partnering with Dairy Business Association, the Wisconsin Farm Bureau Federation, and others to secure nearly \$9 million in state support in the last budget cycle.
