Nutrition Programs Struggle for Funding as Shutdown Continues



As the federal government shutdown enters its third week with no resolution in sight, the U.S. Department of Agriculture's (USDA) leader for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) sent a <u>letter</u> instructing regional and state SNAP directors to <u>delay the distribution of funds</u> for November. USDA and the White House have also said they will <u>redirect \$300</u> <u>million in tariff revenue</u> to fund the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC), though it's unclear whether that revenue has been distributed. **READ MORE...**

Federal Report Warns of Immigration Crackdown Consequences



In an October 2 <u>report</u> filed in the Federal Register, the U.S. Department of Labor said the Trump Administration's increased focus on immigration enforcement <u>threatens</u> "the <u>stability of domestic food production and prices for U.S. consumers"</u>. The report contradicts U.S. Department of Agriculture Secretary Brooke Rollins' statement that the nation's farm workforce will become "100 percent American," noting that the U.S. does not have an adequate supply of workers to address the agricultural labor shortage. The Department further <u>urges "immediate reform"</u> of the current immigration system. READ MORE...



California has enacted a new law defining and restricting the sale of "particularly harmful" ultra-processed foods (UPFs) in public schools. The measure directs state agencies to adopt regulations to define particularly harmful UPFs by July 1, 2026, with some restrictions beginning to taking effect in 2032. Class 1 milk and nonfat flavored milk are specifically exempt from the law, ensuring continued access to milk in school meal programs. READ MORE...

H5N1 Response

Wisconsin Moves to Reduced Milk Testing Schedule

As of October 1, Wisconsin will move to a 50 percent reduced testing frequency for H5N1, as a result of the state's unaffected Gold Status in USDA's National Milk Testing Strategy. The Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (WDATCP) will continue using existing routine milk samples to support ongoing surveillance. To date, more than 19,000 milk samples have been tested with no detections of H5N1. WDATCP updates milk testing data weekly on its website. READ MORE...



New Study Suggests H5N1 May Remain in Aged Raw Milk Cheeses



A <u>new study</u>, conducted by a team from Cornell University, found that infectious H5N1 virus remained in raw milk cheeses throughout production and after 120 days of aging. Viral survival depended on the pH level of the raw milk, with results found in cheeses made with raw milk at pH levels of 6.6 and 5.8, but not 5.0. Notably, ferrets that were fed the virus-spiked raw milk cheese did not become infected with H5N1. <u>READ MORE...</u>

Wisconsin Child Care Assistance Increases



Wisconsin Shares child care subsidy rates have increased following an investment of more than \$123 million in the state's 2025-27 biennial budget. WCMA advocated for this continued child care support, recognizing the critical role it plays in sustaining Wisconsin's dairy workforce and rural communities. These investments are expected to lower costs for approximately 15,000 families. READ MORE...
