



Wisconsin Adjusts Definition of Outbreak in Updated COVID-19 Employer Guidance



The Wisconsin Department of Health Services (WDHS) has updated its definition of a workplace outbreak to **two cases within a 14-day period**, as opposed to two cases within a 28-day period. WCMA had been talking with WDHS officials about this matter, and views this change as an improvement.

The new definition is now reflected on Pages 11 and 17 of a just-released COVID-19 employer guidance, called Preventing & Managing COVID-19 Outbreaks in the Workplace. This resource includes:

- A step-by-step guide for what to do, when a worker tests positive for COVID-19
- An explanation of what to expect when working with local public health officials
- A rundown of various tests and testing strategies, including serial testing
- Printable forms for wellness tracking

Mnuchin, Pelosi Continue Relief Package Negotiations As Senate Votes on PPP Reauthorization

U.S. Treasury Secretary Steven Mnuchin and House Speaker Nancy Pelosi (D-CA) are continuing

<u>negotiations</u> over a coronavirus relief package, after making progress toward compromise on Monday. Pelosi has set a soft deadline of determining by the end of the day whether agreement can be reached and a bill approved before Election Day.

Meanwhile, the Republican-led U.S. Senate today is voting on a <u>standalone bill</u> to authorize another round of Paycheck Protection Program loans. It's unlikely to be voted on by the House of Representatives, with Democrats leading the body favoring more comprehensive legislation.

"We're All In" Grants Now Available



Apply now for the Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation's (WEDC) second round of "We're All In" Small Business Grants. A total of \$50 million is available, and WEDC aims to provide grants of \$5,000 each to 10,000 businesses.

Eligible businesses are Wisconsin-based, employ 50 or fewer full-time workers, and made less than \$1 million in revenue (gross receipts less returns and allowances) last year.

Wisconsin Capacity Limits Order Reimposed

A Wisconsin judge Monday <u>reimposed an order</u> from Governor Tony Evers' administration limiting the capacity inside bars and restaurants statewide to 25 percent, saying that proprietors had never followed the order and thus could not argue it had harmed their businesses. This action overturns a <u>temporary injunction</u> another judge had issued last Wednesday, after the order was challenged by the Tavern League of Wisconsin.

WCMA Advocates for Common Food Name Protection

WCMA is calling on members of the U.S. House of Representatives to sign a <u>bipartisan letter</u> urging the U.S. Trade Representative and U.S. Department of Agriculture prioritize the protection of common food names in future trade negotiations.

American dairy manufacturers have increasingly been shut out of markets around the world due to the European Union's prolific misuse of Geographical Indications (GIs) to block U.S. cheeses from being sold in third-party markets under common names such as "parmesan" and "mozzarella." A similar Senate letter was sent to the Trump Administration on July 30.

Mexico Resolving Issues With Dairy Manufacturers After Halting Sales Over Alleged Labeling Issues

Mexico's government is now resolving issues with numerous global dairy food suppliers, including Sargento and Philadephia, after halting the sale of 20 dairy products over allegations of labeling violations last week. For more information, see the news articles linked below:

WTO Clearing New EU Tariffs on U.S. Cheeses

The European Union expects to gain formal clearance from the World Trade Organization next week to impose tariffs on \$4 billion of annual U.S. imports - including numerous fresh cheeses and cheddar - in a dispute over aircraft subsidies.

Lawmakers Urge HHS, USDA to Reaffirm Dairy's Role in Healthy Diets

A bipartisan group of 55 Congressional members, led by U.S. Representatives Anthony Brindisi (D-NY) and Glenn "GT" Thompson (R-PA), this week sent a <u>letter</u> to U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) Secretary Alex Azar and U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Secretary Sonny Perdue, urgind them to reaffirm the role of dairy foods in healthy diets. The lawmakers also request that the agencies include findings from studies that have demonstrated beneficial or neutral effects of dairy foods at all fat levels in the upcoming release of dietary guidelines.

USDA Awards Cheddar Cheese Contracts

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) announced today <u>successful bids</u> for the purchase of 64 million pounds of cheddar cheese. USDA will purchase products from WCMA members Agropur, Associated Milk Producers, Inc., Great Lakes Cheese Company, Hilmar Cheese Company, Masters Gallery Foods, and Winona Foods, as well as Bongards' Creameries and Land O' Lakes, for distribution throughout 2021.


