- You can preview your ballot online.
- Polls are officially open through 8 p.m. tonight, and you must be allowed to cast a ballot if you are in line at that time.

U.S. Representatives Urge Protection of Common Cheese Names, Trade Opportunity

U.S. Representatives Jim Costa (D-CA), Jodey Arrington (R-TX), Angie Craig (D-MN), Dusty Johnson (R-SD), Ron Kind (D-WI), Mike Gallagher (R-WI), Jimmy Panetta (D-CA) and Mike Kelly (R-PA), together with a bipartisan coalition of 103 of their Congressional peers, yesterday sent a letter to the U.S. Trade Representative's Office (USTR) and the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) urging them to protect common cheese and wine terms in all current and future trade negotiations. The European Union's prolific misuse of geographical indications has blocked U.S. cheeses from being sold in third-party markets under common names such as "parmesan" and "mozzarella."

A <u>similar letter</u>, led by Senators John Thune (R-SD) and Debbie Stabenow (D-MI) garnered support from a total of 61 Senators and was sent to USTR and USDA in July.

WCMA proudly partnered with National Milk Producers Federation to advocate for members, and

urge Congressional support for the letters.



CDC Considers Vaccine Priority Access Plan

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) met Friday to discuss a plan to distribute COVID-19 vaccines.

The ACIP outline tracks with recommendations made by other groups, with priority vaccine access to be given first to healthcare personnel, and essential workers, adults with underlying medical conditions, and adults aged 65 and older to follow. A modeling study presented at the ACIP meeting showed prioritizing adults ages 65 and older would avert more COVID-19 deaths, but prioritizing adults with high-risk medical conditions and essential workers would avert more COVID-19 infections

ACIP will not make its final determinations until the Food and Drug Administration approves a specific

vaccine, as their efficacies vary depending on a recipient's age and underlying medical conditions.



Wisconsin Adds 71 New, Free COVID-19 Testing Sites

The Wisconsin Department of Health Services has announced <u>an expansion of COVID-19 testing</u> <u>sites</u> through the addition of 71 new, free locations in 56 counties and seven tribal nations. These sites have the capacity to test approximately 48,000 people each week.

<u>Community testing sites</u> will be available through December 10 and are open to anyone who lives or works in Wisconsin. Testing sites are funded by the federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act, and Governor Tony Evers has directed more than \$500 million in CARES funding to support Wisconsin's testing efforts.
