USDA Issues New Order Requiring H5N1 Milk Testing



On Friday, the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) released a <u>new federal order</u> requiring that raw (unpasteurized) milk samples nationwide be collected and shared with USDA for testing for highly pathogenic avian influenza (H5N1).

The order will be executed in five stages, beginning with milk silo testing at dairy processing facilities in California, Colorado, Michigan, Mississippi, Oregon, and Pennsylvania. **READ MORE...**

USDA FMMO Voluntary Marketing Agreement Not Required

USDA has sent a letter to all handlers regulated under one or more Federal Milk Marketing Orders, outlining the pending federal order voting process. As required by law, the letter also includes a voluntary marketing agreement that handlers may choose to sign. In discussions with the International Dairy Foods Association and USDA, WCMA has learned that signing and returning the included marketing agreement is not required. Unless a processor wants to commit to a voluntary pooled marketing agreement that follows FMMO rules in the event an order is terminated due to a failed referendum vote, they should not sign and return this letter.

Federal Agencies Seek Input on Food Date Labeling



The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) and the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) are seeking public input on food labeling practices, including the terms "sell by," "use by," and "best by".

The agencies' Request for Information, open until February 3, 2025, seeks industry practices and preferences for date labeling, research results on consumer perceptions of date labeling, and any impact date labeling may have on food waste and grocery costs.
