



CDC Set to Approve Vaccine Distribution Plan

This afternoon, a Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) panel is set to approve a <u>vaccine distribution plan</u> advising that states provide doses to 21 million health care workers and 3 million residents of nursing homes and long-term care facilities first. The nation's first vaccine shipments will be available in mid-December, should the Food and Drug Administration approve an application for emergency use of a vaccine from pharmaceutical company Pfizer on December 10.

The CDC panel will meet again later this month to recommend the next group of eligible individuals, with officials signaling support for a plan to vaccinate 87 million essential workers, including those working in food manufacturing and agriculture. WCMA will alert members to relevant developments.

Moderna Appeals for Vaccine EUA

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration has scheduled a hearing on December 17 to consider a formal request from pharmaceutical company Moderna for emergency use authorization (EUA) of its COVID-19 vaccine. Moderna reports its vaccine is 94.5 percent effective in preventing sickness,

and 100 percent effective in preventing severe cases of COVID-19.

Wisconsin Judge Extends Order Blocking Release of Business Outbreak Information

For a third time, a Waukesha County judge has <u>extended an order</u> preventing the Wisconsin Department of Health Services (WDHS) from releasing the names of businesses that experienced COVID-19 outbreaks between March and the start of July. The new temporary injunction, issued Monday, November 30, will last until the case reaches its conclusion or is overturned by a higher court.

Media outlets initially filed requests for business outbreak information via open records laws in June, engaging in months of negotiations with state officials before the case went to court. Wisconsin Manufacturers & Commerce, together with the Muskego and New Berlin Chambers of Commerce, argue the release of information would violate patient confidentiality laws and "irreparably harm" businesses.

WCMA has directly contacted all members that may be impacted.

Officials from the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (WDATCP) will provide updates to the agency's inspection protocols and regulatory flexibilities, amid the ongoing pandemic.

WDATCP's Bureau of Food and Recreational Businesses, Division of Food and Recreational Safety Manager Tim Anderson is set to present on December 10, alongside WCMA staff. Anderson will detail the agency's new pandemic inspection protocols, plans to continue timing and sealing services, and inspection debit flexibility secured from the U.S. Department of Agriculture and Food and Drug Administration.

WCMA will reserve time at the end of the webinar for WDATCP staff to respond to member questions. WCMA will present pre-submitted questions from members anonymously; simply send them by Tuesday, December 8 to <a href="https://www.wcman.gov/wcman.

Bipartisan Lawmakers Announce \$908B Stimulus Plan

A bipartisan group of U.S. Senators today announced a compromise \$\frac{\$908 \text{ billion economic}}{\text{stimulus proposal}}\$, with the goal of breaking a months-long impasse between the White House and Democrats in the House of Representatives. Their plan includes a \$300-per-week unemployment benefits boost, \$160 \text{ billion in state aid, and a temporary moratorium on coronavirus-related lawsuits against businesses.}

As Deadline Approaches, CFAP 2 Aid Tops \$11 Billion

The U.S. Department of Agriculture this week reports it has distributed \$11.1 billion in direct relief

payments to farmers via the second round of its Coronavirus Food Assistance Program (CFAP), including \$1.05 billion to dairy farmers. USDA will continue to accept applications for CFAP 2 monies through December 11.

Wisconsin Announces New Grants to Support Increased Food Exports to China

The Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (WDATCP) today opened a short application window for new grants to help food manufacturers develop their e-commerce capabilities to target consumers in China. A total of \$90,000 is available for grants of up to \$9,000 per company, with recipients to provide at least 30 percent in matching funding. Grants may be used for consulting support, the purchase of software or advertisements, registration costs for events, and translation services. Those interested should contact WDATCP Economic Development Consultant Ashwini Rao as soon as possible. Applications are due December 18, 2020.

Apply for WCMA Scholarships Totaling \$15,000

The Wisconsin Cheese Makers Association is now accepting applications for five student scholarships worth a total of \$15,000.


In 2021, two students will be awarded the <u>WCMA Myron P. "Mike" Dean Cheese Industry Student Scholarship</u>, worth \$3,000 each. Any employee or child of an employee of a WCMA dairy manufacturing, processing, or marketing member company may apply.

Employees or children of employees at WCMA supplier member companies may apply for the <u>WCMA</u>
<u>Cheese Industry Supplier Student Scholarship</u>. Three students will receive scholarship awards of \$3,000 each.

Applicants must supply transcripts, a letter of recommendation, and a completed application form by Wednesday, February 17, 2021. Forms may be found at WisCheeseMakers.org, or can be directly requested from WCMA Office & Member Service Manager Sara Schmidt.

Successful applicants will be announced in March 2021, with awards made in September.
