USDA Confirms HPAI Strain; WDATCP to Return to 100 Percent Milk Testing Frequency



The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) confirmed Friday that the highly pathogenic avian influenza (HPAI) recently detected in a Wisconsin dairy herd is strain D1.1, the same strain detected in Arizona and New Mexico earlier this year, USDA noted that the Wisconsin detection is a new spillover event from wildlife into dairy cattle, and that no additional herds have been linked to this event. The Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection said it will resume testing at 100 percent frequency under the National Milk Testing Strategy, collecting one sample per farm, per month through routine sampling processes. Both agencies reiterated that there is no risk to consumer health or the safety of the commercial milk supply. **READ MORE...**

Dairy cattle in a total of 18 states have been infected since the start of the HPAI outbreak in March 2024, but USDA has noted <u>very limited cases in a small number of states this year</u>. A



U.S., Canada to Launch Formal Trade Talks in January



The U.S. and Canada will meet in mid-January to formally discuss the U.S.-Mexico-Canada Agreement (USCMA), <u>trade</u> <u>officials said last week.</u> U.S. Trade Representative Jamieson Greer <u>told a</u> <u>Congressional committee last</u> <u>Wednesday</u> that his office plans to push for expanded U.S. access to Canadian dairy markets, and for limits on Canada's export of dairy proteins. Greer noted he wants to secure changes to the trade agreement before signing off on any extension of the deal, which is up for joint review in 2026. **READ MORE...**

FDA Extends Compliance Date for Food Traceability Final Rule



The FDA has extended the compliance date for the Food Traceability Rule from January 20, 2026, to July 20, 2028. This final rule, Requirements for Additional Traceability Records for Certain Foods, establishes enhanced recordkeeping requirements for businesses that manufacture, process, pack, or hold foods on the Food Traceability List (FTL), including cheese. 
