

Trump Signs COVID-19 Aid Package

President Donald <u>Trump signed</u> legislation Sunday night approving \$892 billion in coronavirus economic aid and \$1.4 trillion in federal spending, narrowly averting a government shutdown. WCMA offered a breakdown of the new law's <u>provisions for the dairy industry</u> in last week's e-newsletter.

Prior to signing, in a <u>video posted to Twitter</u> last week, President Trump had <u>blasted the compromise</u> package, calling for larger direct stimulus payments of \$2,000 for adults and \$600 for children. Democrats in the House of Representatives voted Monday to approve a <u>stand-alone bill</u> reflecting the President's proposed payments, but the measure's fate is uncertain in the Senate.

Evers Plans to Extend Mask Mandate

In a year-end interview with the *Milwaukee Journal Sentinel*, Wisconsin Governor Tony Evers said this week he will <u>extend the statewide face mask mandate</u> in January, in an effort to help stem the spread of coronavirus. His <u>current order</u> is set to expire January 19. The Wisconsin State Supreme Court has heard oral arguments in a lawsuit challenging gubernatorial authority to issue such an order, but has yet to make a ruling.

Wisconsin Offers New COVID Tools

Wisconsin is offering new, free tools to help with efforts to prevent and detect COVID-19.

At-Home COVID-19 Test Kits

Wisconsin Governor Tony Evers this week announced Wisconsin will now offer at-home COVID-19 test kits free of charge. Wisconsinites may order a saliva collection kit online and have it shipped to their home. The kit comes with detailed instructions and a video call with a testing supervisor. Samples are then shipped to a lab via UPS dropboxes for processing.

Contact Tracing App

Wisconsin has launched a new mobile app to expedite the notification of close contacts of those who've tested positive for COVID-19. The free app, <u>WI Exposure Notification</u>, is available for download now in the Google Play store, while iPhone users can simply turn the app on in their phone's settings.

Printable Posters

The Wisconsin Department of Health Services is sharing <u>printable posters</u> on its website, including a poster reflecting <u>updated quarantine options</u>.

\$22M Secured for Dairy Business Innovation Initiatives

With President Donald Trump's signature now on the omnibus federal spending bill, Dairy Business Innovation Initiatives have secured \$22 million in federal support in 2021. WCMA, in partnership with the Center for Dairy Research (CDR) at the University of Wisconsin-Madison, leads one of three regional DBII centers. The WCMA/CDR project, called the Dairy Business Innovation Alliance, provides direct-to-business grants to dairy farmers and processors in Wisconsin, Minnesota, South Dakota, Iowa, and Illinois, and offers free workshops and consultative services to grow the dairy industry.

Apply Now for WDATCP Dairy Processor Grants



Wisconsin dairy processors may apply for Dairy Processor Grants of up to \$50,000, now through January 15, 2021. Grants may be used to support food safety projects, staff training, plant expansion or modernization, and professional consulting services. Matching funds are required at 20 percent of the grant request. Funds will be awarded in February 2021, following a competitive review process. In 2020, WDATCP awarded 11 grants worth a total of \$200,000.



Apply for WCMA Scholarships Totaling \$15,000

WCMA is now accepting applications for five student scholarships worth a total of \$15,000.

In 2021, two students will be awarded the <u>WCMA Myron P. "Mike" Dean Cheese Industry Student Scholarship</u>, worth \$3,000 each. Any employee or child of an employee of a WCMA dairy manufacturing, processing, or marketing member company may apply.

Employees or children of employees at WCMA supplier member companies may apply for the <u>WCMA Cheese Industry Supplier Student Scholarship</u>. Three students will receive scholarship awards of \$3,000 each.

Applicants must supply transcripts, a letter of recommendation, and a completed application form by Wednesday, February 17, 2021. Forms may be found at WisCheeseMakers.org, or can be directly requested from WCMA Office & Member Service Manager Sara Schmidt.


Successful applicants will be announced in March 2021, with awards made in September.

The Central Wisconsin Cheesemakers and Buttermakers Association is accepting <u>applications</u> for two educational scholarships worth \$1,500 each. Applications are due March 31, 2021.
