

## Wisconsin Food, Dairy Workers Proposed for Third, Not Second Wave of Vaccinations

The Wisconsin State Disaster Medical Advisory Committee (SDMAC) vaccine distribution subcommittee this morning approved <u>draft recommendations</u>, further breaking down Centers for Disease Control and Prevention guidance, indicating **there will now be a Phase 1B vaccination group and a Phase 1C vaccination group**. These groups will be eligible to receive doses after Wisconsin's 320,000 front-line health care workers and 22,000 people living in assisted living facilities and nursing homes have been served.

SDMAC's **Phase 1B recommendations do not include food processing workers**, but instead would direct vaccinations to the following groups:

- Wisconsinites aged 70 or older (682,451 people)
- Police and fire personnel (27,880 people)
- Educators (160,000 people)
- Additional health care personnel, including cleaning staff and IT (25,000 people)
- Inmates and group housing (117,000 people)
- Mink farmers (300 people)

State officials indicate that **Phase 1C will likely include food processing workers** and others in close-quarters manufacturing jobs, grocery store staff, public transit workers, as well as people aged 65 and older and adults with high-risk medical conditions.

The Wisconsin Department of Health Services (WDHS) and Governor Tony Evers will make final determinations within the next few weeks, though WDHS officials have announced, at minimum, they will advance plans to vaccinate <u>police and fire personnel</u>, with distribution to begin as early as next week. As of Monday, WDHS reported having administered more than 150,000 vaccine doses, including 11,000 second (final) doses. A <u>tracking site</u>, launched in early January, offers updates each Monday.

Public comments on the SDMAC recommendations are being accepted via <a href="mailto:email">email</a>. WCMA maintains regular communications with WDHS and the Evers Administration, advocating for the earliest-

possible access to vaccine supplies for members.

# Operation Warp Speed to Release More Vaccines in Storage, Following Governors' Request

Operation Warp Speed (OWS) officials today agreed to send states additional coronavirus vaccine doses, as requested by Wisconsin Governor Tony Evers, Minnesota Governor Tim Walz, Michigan Governor Gretchen Whitmer, Illinois Governor J.B. Pritzker, California Governor Gavin Newsom, New York Governor Andrew Cuomo, Kansas Governor Laura Kelly, and Washington Governor Jay Inslee in a <u>letter</u> sent late last week.

Roughly 50 percent of prepared vaccine doses are currently being held in federal storage, according to an OWS plan to mitigate potential challenges in vaccine manufacturing and distribution.

#### Other States Share Details on Vaccination Plans

#### Illinois

Late last week, Illinois Governor J.B. Pritzker revealed <u>new details</u> about the state's next phase of vaccinations, noting that Phase 1B will begin when "Phase 1A is substantially complete." Illinois' Phase 1B includes food processing workers, but the group includes 3.2 million Illinois residents, meaning that it could take months to complete vaccinations.

#### **South Dakota**

South Dakota state officials have released details on its <u>vaccination distribution groups</u>, with food processing workers included in Group E. The state is currently vaccinating Group C, which includes health care workers, long-term care facility residents, correctional officers and other first responders.

The state has also launched a site detailing where to find vaccine providers, with more information to be added when doses are more broadly available.

# **Minnesota Launches Vaccine Tracking Site**

The Minnesota Department of Health on Monday launched an <u>online dashboard</u> for tracking COVID-19 vaccine distribution statewide. The dashboard will offer daily updates on the number of doses of the vaccine that have been administered, and the number of doses that have been shipped to Minnesota.

# Wisconsin Senate GOP Approves Compromise Coronavirus Package, Gains Evers' Support

Wisconsin State Senate today approved a <u>substitute amendment</u> to the Assembly Bill 1, a COVID-19 package proposed by Assembly Republicans. The initial bill failed to garner support from Senate Republicans, or Governor Tony Evers.


The new, pared-back Senate proposal retains strong civil liability protections from COVID-19 suits, but preserves an employer's right to determine its own vaccination policies, two priorities for which **WCMA advocated**.

The Senate proposal also preserves the Governor's right to direct future federal COVID-19 aid to the state without legislative approval, health officers' rights to continue emergency orders and set vaccination orders, and school districts' rights to offer virtual education without school board votes.

Senate Majority Leader Devin LeMahieu (R-Oostburg) reportedly directly negotiated the details on the

amendment with the Evers Administration. Governor Tony Evers released a statement moments ago noting his gratitude for LeMahieu's focus on "common ground" and calling the bill a "good faith effort in compromise and bipartisanship." Evers called on Assembly Republican leaders to approve the bill as amended and send it to his desk for signing without delay.

Assembly Speaker Robin Vos (R-Rochester) has yet to comment on the package as amended.




# WCMA Policy Committee Advocates for Member Priorities in COVID-19 Bill, Other Legislation

Members of the WCMA Policy Committee are advocating for the dairy processing industry at the federal and state level, and this week met with Wisconsin state lawmakers to detail WCMA priorities in pending COVID-19 legislation and for the legislative session ahead. We thank members for their impactful engagement, and welcome all members to join in this effort.

Also this week, WCMA outlined policy priorities in a <u>letter to state lawmakers</u>. The letter notes broad industry support for civil liability protection against COVID-19 lawsuits, preservation of employers' rights to set vaccination policies, grants for businesses that have retrofitted facilities and changed operations to protect employees from COVID-19, and additional support for the Food Security Initiative. It also details WCMA support of truth-in-dairy labeling legislation, investments in dairy exporting initiatives, dairy processing innovation and modernization grants, support for high-value grazing and organic dairy initiatives, and continued funding for the Dairy Innovation hub and Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection.

# FDA Clarifies Cheese Types Covered in Proposed "Additional Traceability Records" Rule

Today, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration <u>offered language</u> clarifying the cheeses involved in its newly-proposed rule on "Requirements for Additional Traceability Records for Certain Foods." FDA proposed this added traceability paperwork for certain foods on September 23, and in December pushed the deadline for public comments on these <u>proposed regulations</u> to February 22, 2021.

FDA clarified that hard cheeses – cheeses with less than 39 percent moisture, such as cheddar, Romano and parmesan – are not included in the requirements of the new, proposed regulation. FDA also improved its initial description of cheeses facing this regulation. Instead of simply stating, "Includes all soft ripened or semi-soft cheeses, and fresh soft cheeses that are made with pasteurized or unpasteurized milk," FDA has added more detail and examples.

The new description of cheeses affected by this proposed regulation reads: "Includes all cheeses made with either pasteurized or unpasteurized milk, other than hard cheeses. Includes soft ripened/semi-soft cheeses (e.g., brie, camembert, feta, mozzarella, taleggio, blue, brick, fontina, monterey jack, and muenster) and soft unripened/fresh soft cheeses (e.g., cottage, chevre/goat, cream, mascarpone, ricotta, queso blanco, queso fresco, queso de crema, and queso de puna)."

## **Apply for WCMA Scholarships Totaling \$15,000**


WCMA is now accepting applications for five student scholarships worth a total of \$15,000.
