

COVID-19 Transmission From Food, Food Packaging Highly Unlikely, Say Feds

There is "no credible evidence" that people can contract COVID-19 from food or food packaging, U.S. officials again affirmed in a **joint statement** released late last week.

Officials from the U.S. Department of Agriculture, U.S. Food and Drug Administration and U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention acknowledged that recent scientific studies have identified COVID-19 particles on food packaging but emphasized the fact that researchers have found only the genetic fingerprint of the virus, not live virus that can result in infection.

Wisconsin Lawmakers Add COVID-19 Liability

Protection to Unemployment Aid Bill

Wisconsin lawmakers are on track to approve <u>WCMA-backed COVID-19 liability</u> <u>protections</u> for businesses, after successfully tacking the measure onto a special session bill from Governor Tony Evers, aimed at modernizing the state's unemployment insurance system. The State Assembly approved the measure with bipartisan support earlier today, and quick Senate action is expected. Evers has signaled his support for the bill, too.

Wisconsin Prepares for Phase 1B Vaccination, Beginning March 1

Wisconsin is preparing to <u>launch Phase 1B</u> of its COVID-19 vaccination distribution plan on March 1, allowing some essential workers - including dairy plant personnel - access to vaccines. Those in the Phase 1B group have numerous paths to vaccination, including access via traditional health care providers, pharmacies, community-based clinics, and - in some cases - employer-supported on-site clinics.

Here's a round-up of relevant developments and resources for Wisconsin-based WCMA members includied in Phase 1B.

Online Vaccine Registry Coming March 1

On March 1, Wisconsin will launch an <u>online vaccine registry</u>, designed to help people find appointments. A call center will also be opened, to assist those without access to a computer or internet. The state has already begun testing the system, allowing certain public health departments early access. Those testing the system this week include Green County Public Health, Marathon County Public Health, St. Croix County Public Health, where many members operate. Contact your <u>county public health office</u> for more information.

Verifying Phase 1B Status Simplified

Wisconsin is requesting vaccinators attempt to verify that an individual is eligible for Phase 1B vaccination. This can be achieved by an individual showing a work badge or ID card, pay stub, or letter from an employer to a vaccinator. However, Wisconsin will also allow individuals to simply sign a self-attestation form, made available to them by their vaccinator.

Federal Retail Pharmacy Partner Gets Boost

Wisconsin has selected Walgreens as its partner in the Federal Retail Pharmacy Program, and the chain continues to expand its vaccination capacity statewide. This week, 178 Walgreens locations in Wisconsin will be receiving a total of 35,350 vaccine doses, double the amount it received last week. To schedule a vaccination appointment, call 1-800-Walgreens or visit the Walgreens online registration website.

New Community-Based Clinics Opening

Wisconsin officials today <u>announced plans</u> to open four new community-based COVID-19 vaccination clinics in La Crosse County, Marathon County, Racine County, and a location yet to be determined to serve both Barron and Douglas Counties. Clinics will be open within two months. Last week, the state opened its first community-based vaccination clinic in Rock County, and that location will remain open. Locations were selected to address gaps in vaccine access caused by local health care capacity, pharmacy concentration, and population demographics.

ADVOCACY

WCMA Members Continue Push in Wisconsin for Truth in Dairy Labeling

WCMA continues to lobby lawmakers to support two bills designed to protect consumers from misleading labels on imitation "dairy" products.

Senate Bills 81 and 83, authored by Senator Howard Marklein (R-Spring Green) and Representative Travis Tranel (R-Cuba City), would ban the labeling of products as milk or as a dairy product or ingredient, if the food is not made from the milk of a cow, sheep, goat, or other mammals.



As part of this effort, WCMA President Dave Buholzer of Klondike Cheese Company wrote a <u>editorial for Wisconsin-based newspapers</u> acknowledging Sen. Marklein's leadership on this issue. DBIA Plans \$1M in Grant Awards in Spring 2021; Application Period Opens March 1



Mark your calendars! The <u>Dairy Business</u> <u>Innovation Alliance</u>, a partnership between the Center for Dairy Research and Wisconsin Cheese Makers Association will open a <u>new grant</u> <u>application period</u> March 1. DBIA is planning total awards of \$1 million in direct-to-business grants this spring, with individual awards of up to \$50,000.

Dairy processors and farmers in Illinois, Iowa, Minnesota, South Dakota, and Wisconsin are eligible to apply for grants to support dairy farm diversification, the creation of value-added dairy products, and dairy product exporting.

WCMA will share additional information on this grant opportunity next week.

Apply Now for Buy Local, Buy Wisconsin Grants



The Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection today opened the application period for Buy Local, Buy Wisconsin grants, designed to support the purchase of Wisconsin-made products in Wisconsin. Wisconsin-based dairy processors and farmers are eligible to apply for grants of up to \$50,000 through 12 noon (CT) on March 26. WDATCP has a total of \$300,000 to award through the Buy Local, Buy Wisconsin program.


WCMA is partnering with Collegiate Dairy Products Evaluation Contest organizers to invite
