Congress Passes Spending Bill, Avoiding Government Shutdown



Late last week, U.S. Senators voted 54-46 to approve a \$1.7 trillion federal spending bill, avoiding a shutdown that was set to take effect at midnight that same day. President Trump signed the bill on Saturday, funding the government through September 30, when the current fiscal year ends. The House approved the bill last Tuesday on a party-line vote. The spending package essentially extends the 2018 Farm Bill through September. It includes an increase of \$500 million for the Women, Infants and Children (WIC) nutrition assistance program, as well as \$3 million to launch more Healthy Fluid Milk Incentives projects. Further, the bill provides a boost for the Commodity Supplemental Food Program, which supports low-income senior citizens. It also increases defense spending by \$6 billion and cuts non-defense spending by \$13 billion, mostly by eliminating previously enacted Congressional funding directives, or "earmarks."

Trump Announces More Tariffs Coming April 2

President Trump yesterday confirmed he <u>will not provide exemptions</u> to tariffs on steel and aluminum imports, and announced plans to roll out new reciprocal and sectorial tariffs on April 2. He did not specify the industry sectors to be impacted.

The announcement comes as Canada and the European Union (EU) prepare to implement retaliatory tariffs, and Mexico weighs similar action. The EU has announced a **second round of retaliatory tariffs** to hit mid-April on a wide variety of U.S. goods, including dairy products.



Canada has adopted a 25 percent tariff on \$21 billion in American-made products, including \$212 million of dairy products. Canadian leaders are also making plans for a second tranche of agricultural tariffs.



FDA Releases Findings from H5N1 Studies on Raw Milk Cheese



On Friday, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) released findings from two research efforts regarding highly pathogenic avian influenza (HPAI H5N1). WCMA is urging FDA officials to act quickly to make resources available for raw milk cheesemakers, including testing avenues for finished product and further studies on these initial findings. Senate Committee Advances Makary for FDA Commissioner

The U.S. Senate Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions Committee <u>voted on</u>

Thursday to advance Dr. Marty Makary's nomination as FDA Commissioner, clearing the way for his expected approval by the full Senate. Makary, a Johns Hopkins surgeon, <u>pledged to examine</u> seed oils and food dyes in school lunches and has indicated support for the Trump Administration's positions on vaccines and the reduction of the federal workforce. <u>READ MORE...</u>
