

# Wisconsin Begins Vaccination of Phase 1B; Dairy Processors May Seek Appointments

The State of Wisconsin on Monday <u>opened COVID-19 vaccination eligibility</u> to its Phase 1B population, including essential employees in Wisconsin dairy manufacturing and processing plants.

Eligibility does not guarantee an immediate vaccination appointment, and Wisconsin is urging vaccinators to continue to prioritize appointments for members of the Phase 1A population and for educators and child care providers in the Phase 1B population. State officials anticipate vaccination of the Phase 1B population will take several months.

#### **How to Get an Appointment**

There are many ways for a person in the Phase 1B population to secure a vaccination appointment. Here are the primary options:

- Call your health care provider.
- Call 1-800-Walgreens or visit <a href="www.walgreens.com/findcare/vaccination/covid-19">www.walgreens.com/findcare/vaccination/covid-19</a> to find a Walgreens pharmacy that is scheduling vaccine appointments nearest to you. Walgreens is Wisconsin's selected Federal Retail Pharmacy Partner, and received vaccine doses directly from the federal government, in addition to the state's official allocation.
- Make use of the <u>Wisconsin Vaccine Registry</u>, expected to launch in early March. The registry will allow individuals to fill out a questionnaire determining their eligibility for the COVID-19 vaccine and then walk them through the appointment scheduling process. If an individual is not yet eligible to get the vaccine, or no appointments are currently available, they can be placed on a wait-list.
- Participate in a community-based vaccination clinic. To determine if, when and where a clinic is being held, **contact your county public health officer**.
- Participate in an employer-supported on-site vaccination clinic. Employers who wish
  to host a clinic should <u>contact their county public health officer</u> to be connected
  with a vaccinator.

#### **Verification of Phase 1B Status**

Wisconsin officials note that employers are welcome to provide a letter that their employees could present at the time of vaccination to verify their status as a member of

Phase 1B. WCMA has prepared a <u>sample, fillable letter</u> for your use. An employee's pay stub or work ID can also be used to verify status. Self-attestation forms will also be available for Phase 1B employees to sign when they are vaccinated, if they do not have another way to verify their status.

Note, a person cannot be asked to show any government-issued ID when receiving the vaccine.

# Minnesota Likely to Begin Essential Worker Vaccination in Late March

Minnesota officials today confirmed the state will <u>begin vaccination of essential</u> <u>workers</u>, including dairy processing workers, as well as those individuals deemed medically vulnerable, once 70 percent of its senior population are vaccinated, perhaps by the end of March. State health officials say many front-line essential workers will be vaccinated at their workplace.

# One-Dose Johnson & Johnson Vaccine Approved; 4M Doses Immediately Distributed

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration <u>approved Johnson & Johnson's COVID-19</u> <u>vaccine</u> for emergency use on Sunday. Unlike the Pfizer and Moderna vaccines, the Johnson & Johnson vaccine requires only one dose, and can be kept in a refrigerator for up to three months, easing shipping and distribution concerns.

Johnson & Johnson is now distributing 4 million doses of the vaccine, and plans to distribute 20 million doses by the end of March. Wisconsin will receive 47,000 doses of the Johnson & Johnson vaccine next week, an amount Governor Tony Evers called a "game changer."

# Senate Set to Consider \$1.9T Relief Package

The U.S. Senate is set to take up President Joe Biden's \$1.9 trillion coronavirus aid package this week, following House approval on Saturday. Democrats are working to get the package approved by March 14, when many unemployment aids are set to expire. Vice President Kamala Harris will likely have to break a tied Senate vote, as the outcome is expected to fall on party lines in the 50-50 chamber.

Here's a look at what's in the package.

#### **Direct Relief Payments**

The legislation provides \$422 billion for a tax rebate amounting to \$1,400 for a single taxpayer, or \$2,800 for a married couple that files jointly, plus \$1,400 per dependent. Individuals earning up to \$75,000 would get the full amount, as would married couples with joint incomes up to \$150,000, with decreasing amounts of aid until the program's cut-off at \$100,000 for a single taxpayer and \$200,000 for married couples.

#### **Child Tax Break**

The package will increase the federal child tax credit to \$3,000 for each child aged 6-17 and to \$3,600 for each younger child; the current tax credit per child is \$2,000. Families would receive the full credits, regardless of how much they make in a year.

#### **Business Aid**

The bill provides another \$7.25 billion for the Paycheck Protection Program, and establishes a new \$25 billion program to support restaurants and bars hurt by the pandemic.

#### **Unemployment Aid**

The bill extends expanded federal unemployment benefits, with an increase to \$400 per week over and above current state offerings.

#### **Pandemic Initiatives**

The bill provides \$46 billion to expand COVID-19 testing and contact tracing, and offers \$14 billion to expedite distribution of COVID-19 vaccines.

#### **School Aid**

The bill calls for \$130 billion in aid for K-12 schools, with monies to be used to reduce class sizes, facilitate social distancing, install ventilation systems and purchase personal protective equipment. Colleges and universities stand to receive \$40 billion, to be used to defray pandemic-related losses incurred and to provide more direct aid to students for food, housing and technology.

#### State and Local Government Aid

The legislation would send \$350 billion to state and local governments to offset hits to their tax base, and to support pandemic-related initiatives.

The bill also initially contained a provision to raise the federal minimum wage to \$15 per hour by June 2025, but it is not expected to be included in the final package.

# New Wisconsin Law Grants Co-ops More Flexibilities in Times of Emergency

Late last week, Wisconsin Governor Tony Evers signed a <a href="WCMA-backed bill">WCMA-backed bill</a> into law, allowing cooperatives to hold their annual member meetings and special meetings, and conduct votes, remotely. Wisconsin Act 5 also allows a cooperative's board of directors to adopt by laws that are effective only in an emergency.

# **Apply Now for DBIA Dairy Processor Grants**

Dairy processors and farmers are invited to <a href="mailto:apply now">apply now</a> for direct-to-business grants of up to \$50,000 through the Dairy Business Innovation Alliance (DBIA), a partnership between the Wisconsin Cheese Makers Association and the Center for Dairy Research. This spring, DBIA will award a total of \$1 million in grants.



Dairy processors and farmers in Illinois, Iowa, Minnesota, South Dakota and Wisconsin are eligible to apply. Projects must focus on dairy farm diversification, the development of value-added dairy products, or dairy product exporting. Applications are due April 30. Complete details are available online.

Applicants are encouraged to attend a free <u>DBIA webinar</u> on Tuesday, March 9 at 1:30 p.m. CT to gain a better understanding of the reimbursement grant program and tips for submitting a competitive application. Additional details can be found in the <u>DBIA grant</u> <u>quide</u>.

# Vilsack Confirmed as U.S. Agriculture Secretary



Tom Vilsack was sworn into office Wednesday, beginning his second appointment as U.S. Department of Agriculture Secretary. The Senate voted overwhelmingly to confirm him on Tuesday.

Vilsack served as USDA Secretary during the Obama Administration, the only member of the Cabinet to complete two full terms. Most recently, he served as president and CEO of the U.S. Dairy Export Council, and has been a strong advocate for the dairy industry.

WCMA has supported the Vilsack nomination throughout the process, previously urging his confirmation in a **letter** delivered in early February.

# **Register Now for WCMA Virtual Job Fair**


