WCMA Joins Wisconsin Lawmakers in Call for Investments in Dairy Export Program

Wisconsin Cheese Makers Association members joined with Wisconsin State Representative Tony Kurtz (R-Wonewoc) and Senator Joan Ballweg (R-Markesan) at a news conference introducing the <u>lawmakers</u>' <u>bill</u> to support expanded exports of Wisconsin agricultural products.

The legislation would direct \$5 million to a joint programmatic effort run by the Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation and Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection through June 2027, designed to support at least 25 percent growth in the total value of the state's agricultural exports. A total of \$2.5 million would be earmarked to support the growth of Wisconsin dairy exports.

Representing dairy processors, Jack Heinemann, export sales manager at WCMA member Specialty Cheese Company noted, ""Wisconsin dairy processors are doing a great job reaching American consumers, who – on average – are eating more than 40 pounds of cheese per year. But if we don't look beyond our borders and gain a foothold in emerging global markets, we're limiting the dairy industry's future growth."

The concept of investing in dairy exports has bipartisan backing in Wisconsin. As part of his budget plan, Governor Tony Evers proposes directing \$2 million to launch and fund the Wisconsin Initiative for Agricultural Exports over a two-year period, with \$1 million earmarked for dairy endeavors.



Wisconsin Truth-in-Dairy Labeling Bills Advance

On Wednesday, April 7, the Wisconsin State Assembly Committee on Agriculture advanced Assembly Bills 73 and 74, legislation designed to protect consumers from misleading labels on imitation "dairy" products. The proposals, authored by Senator Howard Marklein (R-Spring Green) and Representative Travis Tranel (R-Cuba City), would ban the labeling of products as milk or as a dairy product or ingredient, if the food is not made from the milk of a cow, sheep, goat, or other mammals.

Both bills are now eligible for floor votes in the Assembly and Senate, and WCMA continues to advocate with legislative leaders on members' behalf.

WCMA Comments on Processor Costs in Proposed Wisconsin Land Application Rules

Regulatory proposals to curtail landspreading of liquid manure during winter months in Wisconsin will directly impact dairy manufacturers. WCMA offered processor concerns with land availability and added costs to land apply or process wastewater and sludges in public comments for the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (WDNR) this week.

Proposed changes to NR 151, related to farm nutrient management, would lower nitrogen application limits on more than three million cropland acres in Wisconsin. A key prohibition would stop landspreading of liquid manure after September 1 through the end of winter, with some exceptions. Land application of stored liquid manure would be concentrated

into spring months.

"This concentration of a high volume of nutrient application into a small timeframe in the springtime will undoubtedly impact land made available by producers for land application of industrial sludges and wastewaters from WPDES permitholders," WCMA wrote in comments on the economic impact analysis tied to the proposed rules.

WCMA defined millions of dollars in costs dairy processors will face if farms limit land availability in spring. WCMA members noted costs for hauling waste products, building new storage for waste streams, paying municipalities to process wastes or adoption of new technology, such as sludge drying, to comply with the proposed rule. In its draft economic analysis, Wisconsin DNR defined zero costs to processors.

Beyond reopening this economic analysis to include new costs that food and dairy businesses will face, Wisconsin Cheese Makers Association urged WDNR leadership and staff: "to engage in a holistic discussion with all its regulated partners regarding the land application of nutrients in the state of Wisconsin with the goal of developing a guiding strategy that reflects environmental concerns balanced by Wisconsin's opportunity to retain and grow in its role as a crucial food producer for the U.S. and nations abroad."

The Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (WDATCP) is encouraging registration for two upcoming dairy export trade shows.


Register by May 30 for the China Dairy Expo on July 17-20 to showcase your company and products with or without traveling. China Dairy Expo is the largest dairy show in China.

FDA Pauses Distribution of Johnson & Johnson Vaccine, Expected to Last a "Matter of Days"

Today, U.S. Food and Drug Administration officials announced a <u>pause in the</u> <u>distribution</u> of the Johnson & Johnson COVID-19 vaccine, saying they expected it to last a "matter of days" as the agency investigates six reported cases of blood clots forming in women who received the shot. Federal officials said that anyone who received the vaccine and experienced symptoms like severe headache, abdominal pain, leg pain or shortness of breath in the three weeks following the shot should alert their health care provider. Officials said the events appear to be extremely rare, and that they have not found the other authorized coronavirus vaccines – Pfizer and Moderna - to cause such clots.


