China Announces Retaliatory Tariffs on All U.S. Products



Chinese officials responded to President Donald Trump's tariff escalation on Friday, imposing duties of 125 percent on American goods, including dairy. President Trump last week increased tariffs on Chinese products to 145 percent. China's Foreign Ministry also signaled the country would not engage in any further "tit-for-tat" action, noting in a statement, "Given the current level of tariffs, U.S. goods exported to China are no longer market-viable."

Wisconsin Shares Plan for H5N1 Milk Testing Participation



On Monday, April 14, Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade, and Consumer Protection (WDATCP) officials shared that they have submitted a <u>draft of a cooperative agreement</u> to the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) to enable the start of the state's active participation in the National Milk Testing Strategy (NMTS) program.

WDATCP Secretary Randy Romanski noted that while the state awaits USDA sign-off, his agency will begin to <u>inform producers</u> of what to expect in the weeks to come. The state's plan is to use milk samples that are already sent in for lab testing to monitor for H5N1, with farms to be notified only if a positive result is found. Processors would not receive a notification of a positive automatically, though producers would be encouraged to communicate findings. WDATCP staff has already shared <u>a protocol</u> for action if H5N1 is confirmed. Pasteurization continues to be emphasized as an effective method for deactivating the virus.

The expected cost of Wisconsin's participation in the NMTS is \$1.2 million, with the federal government set to reimburse that amount.

H5N1 has not yet been detected in Wisconsin dairy herds, in spite of 6,000 tests conducted already via other programs. Nationwide, more than 1,000 herds have been infected in 17 states.

New DBIA Report Offers Valuable Info for Specialty Cheesemakers

Specialty cheesemakers can grow their market share through consumer education, sampling and trial size products, and creative promotional campaigns, according to a <u>report released last week</u> by the Dairy Business Innovation Alliance (DBIA).

DBIA partners WCMA and the Center for Dairy Research partnered with market intelligence firm Ipsos to conduct a survey in Fall 2024 and produce the report. The final document reveals a wealth of valuable insights, including:

- Sampling opportunities and trial sizes are key to encouraging consumer exploration within the specialty cheese category.
- One-third of Americans say sales and promotions are the top avenue of increasing their specialty cheese consumption, making discounts and promotions especially important.
- Over 40 percent of specialty cheese consumers indicated that education displayed on packaging, social media, and other online avenues would encourage them to consume specialty cheese more often and branch out beyond familiar varieties.

The DBIA is supported by funding from the U.S. Department of Agriculture and was created in the 2018 federal Farm Bill. Since then, the Alliance has awarded over \$20 million in more than 250 grants to small and medium-sized dairy businesses.

California Hearing on Dairy Quota System May 5

The California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA) will hold a <u>public hearing</u> on Monday, May 5, 2025, at 10:00 a.m. (PT) to gather input on a <u>petition to terminate the Quota Implementation Plan</u> (QIP) initially filed in August 2024. All California market milk producers and processors may attend and provide testimony, with those wishing to speak signing up upon arrival. The hearing is the next step in a referendum process, and guestions may be directed to <u>CDFA staff</u>.
