## WCMA Announces \$100,000 Gift to Center for Dairy Research

Trump to Announce New Tariffs Tomorrow, as Ag Leaders Express **Concern over Plans to Limit Chinese Shipping** 



announce a <u>sweeping round of new tariffs</u> on imports set to take immediate effect Wednesday, April 2 which he has dubbed "Liberation Day." The White House says it will announce tariff details at 4 p.m. (ET) tomorrow. Insiders expect the 30-day reprieve of 25 percent tariffs on certain Mexican and Canadian goods to expire, but on Sunday, Trump signaled openness to new levies on all U.S. trading partners.

Officials from Canada and the European Union say they are ready to retaliate, while leaders from China, Japan, and South Korea plan to coordinate their nations' counter. UK Prime Minister Keir Starmer has said he wants to avoid "a knee-jerk response."

Meantime, agricultural leaders this week also decried <u>plans from the U.S. Trade Representative's</u>

<u>Office</u> to charge China-operated shipping vessels \$1 million to enter U.S. ports and China-built vessels \$1.5 million for entry, a move they say could stifle trade and exacerbate consumer costs. The Trump Administration is also considering a requirement that a certain percentage of all U.S. agricultural goods be exported in U.S.-flagged ships, starting at 1 percent this year and rising to 15 percent by 2032.

### Federal Layoffs Gut FDA Staffing, Among Other Agencies



A <u>new wave of job cuts</u> began at the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) early today, with 10,000 employees fired, including 3,500 from the U.S. Food and Drug Administration. HHS leadership say the cuts are not impacting food inspectors, but include many administrative staff, laboratory technicians, and those working in the Office of Regulatory Programs, Office of Policy & International Engagement, and Center for Veterinary Medicine.

### States Mull, Advance Food Additives Bans, Including Wisconsin

Last week, West Virginia became the latest state to <u>approve food additive restrictions</u>, calling butylate hydroxyanisole (BHA), propylparaben, and FD&C certified colors Blue No. 1, Blue No. 2, Green No. 3, Red No. 3, Red No. 40, Yellow No. 5 and Yellow No. 6 adulterations, with a compliance date of January 1, 2028. West Virgina is also banning the color additives from school nutrition programs by August 1, 2025.

Virginia and California have already banned certain color additives in schools, and at least 20 other states, driven by the "Make American Healthy Again" movement, now have some food additive restriction proposed for legislative consideration.

Wisconsin lawmakers this week began <u>circulation of a related bill</u>, that proposes banning brominated vegetable oil, potassium bromate, propylparaben, azodicarbonamide, red dye 3, or titanium dioxide from food products offered via school nutrition programs. **WCMA encourages any Wisconsin-based business uses any of these additives as an ingredient or as part of their processing to contact <u>WCMA Senior Director of Programs & Policy Rebekah Sweeney</u> by close of business on Thursday, April 3, so that our Association might advocate on your behalf.** 

# Whole Milk for Healthy Kids Bill Hearing Today



The Senate Committee on Agriculture, Nutrition and Forestry this morning held a hearing on the Whole Milk for Healthy Kids Act, a proposal WCMA supports which would allow whole and 2 percent milk to be served in schools, in addition to the skim and 1 percent mandated since 2012. U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Secretary Robert F. Kennedy Jr. recently called the federal dietary guidelines requiring low-fat milk "antiquated" and last month encouraged "full fat/whole milk" to be used in Head Start programs.

## **Dairy Nutrition Incentive Bill Introduced**



On Monday, March 31, U.S. Senators Amy Klobuchar (D-MN) and Roger Marshall (R-KS) and U.S. Representatives Jim Costa (D-CA 21) and Nick Langworthy (R-NY 23) introduced the Dairy Nutrition Incentive Program Act of 2025. This proposal, supported by WCMA, would enable SNAP participants to purchase more milk, cheese, and yogurt with their benefits through the expansion of the Healthy Fluid Milk Incentive program. The bill would also increase funding for this initiative to a mandatory \$10 million per year.

# Lawmakers Push for USDA Reversal of \$1B in Cancelled Purchases for Schools & Food Banks



A group of U.S. senators is <u>calling on the</u> <u>U.S. Department of Agriculture</u> to reverse its cancellation of \$1 billion in Local Food Purchase Assistance Program and Local Food for Schools Program contracts. As of December 2024, 8,000 farmers and processors nationwide benefitted from these initiatives, which supported more fresh dairy, meat, and produce provisions at food banks and schools.

### **Marty Makary Confirmed as FDA Commissioner**

The U.S. Senate voted 56-44 last week to confirm Dr. Marty Makary as the next commissioner of the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA). During his confirmation hearings, Makary, a Johns



Hopkins surgeon, <u>pledged to examine</u> seed oils and food dyes in school lunches and has indicated support for the Trump Administration's positions on vaccines and the reduction of the federal workforce.
