United States and China Agree to 90-Day Tariff Pause



The <u>U.S. and China reached an</u> agreement Monday to pause tariffs for 90 days, a major de-escalation in a trade war between the countries. U.S. tariffs on Chinese imports will now be 30 percent, down from 145 percent, while China has agreed to slash tariffs on American goods to 10 percent from 125 percent for the next three months, as long-term talks continue. **READ MORE...**

United States, United Kingdom Reach Trade Deal



The U.S. and United Kingdom signed a trade deal on May 8, the first such agreement since President Donald Trump announced new tariffs on trading partners. While the U.K. is the world's largest importer of cheese, competitive barriers remain for U.S. exporters, given the European Union's duty-free, quota-free access to the U.K market and Free Trade Agreements that the U.K. has in place with New Zealand and Australia that eliminate all U.K. dairy tariffs within five years. House Agriculture Committee Proposes \$300B in SNAP Cuts

The House Agriculture Committee last night released its <u>budget reconciliation bill</u> designed to support billions in program cuts, in compliance with directives from the



House Budget Committee and the Trump Administration. To meet their budgetary goal and underline their support for \$60 billion in pending Farm Bill programming, House leaders are proposing \$300 billion in cuts over the next decade to hunger relief programs for low-income Americans. Specifically, the House would have states pay for a part of Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Programs (SNAP) benefits, saving the federal government – but not necessarily taxpayers - \$128 billion. The bill would also adjust work requirements and criteria for SNAP recipients who are ablebodied adults without dependents, saving \$92 billion. **READ MORE**...

House Agriculture Committee Chairman Glenn "GT" Thompson (R-PA) has expressed some public concern over proposed budget cuts, noting his hope that a final reconciliation bill crafted by both the House and the Senate, still forthcoming, might include more farm aid.

The House Ag spending plan includes three WCMA member priorities: support for cost-of-production surveys to inform future FMMO adjustments, an extension of Dairy Margin Coverage to 2031, and an extension of support for certain organic production and market analysis programs.

U.S. Senators Call for \$36M in DBI Funding



WCMA applauds a call from six U.S. Senators for \$36 million in funding to the Dairy Business Innovation (DBI) Initiative in the pending 2026 Appropriations Bill. In a letter to the leaders of the Senate Committee on Appropriations – Subcommittee on Agriculture, Sens. Tammy Baldwin (D-WI), Kirsten Gillibrand (D-NY), Peter Welch (D-VT), Angus King (I-ME), Chris Murphy (D-CT), and Bernie Sanders (I-VT) pushed for an increased DBI investment of \$36 million per year, up from the 2018 Farm Bill direction of \$20 million.

This amount is equivalent to WCMA's ask, and accounts for both inflation over the past eight years and equal funding for a fourth center to serve dairy processors and farmers in western states. The Wisconsin-based DBI center, the <u>Dairy Business Innovation Alliance (DBIA)</u>, is a partnership between the Center for Dairy Research and WCMA. DBIA delivers technical assistance, business consulting services, research and development, market analysis and direct-to-business grants.

FDA Extends Comment Period on Front-of-Package Labeling



The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) announced last week that it is extending the comment period for its proposed rule on a front-of-package (FOP) nutrition labeling scheme for 60 days, until July 15. The proposal would require a require a "Nutrition Info Box" on most packaged foods to provide accessible, ataglance nutrition information that details and interprets the saturated fat, sodium, and added sugar content of a food. Comments on the rule may be submitted online.
