#### **Budget Reconciliation Vote Planned in House**



The U.S. House of Representatives is expected to <u>take up a budget</u> <u>reconciliation package</u> later this week, with the goal of passage by Memorial Day.

The House <u>budget reconciliation bill</u> proposes a historic \$300 billion cut in Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits, shifting \$128 billion in hunger relief costs to states. The move is designed to meet the Trump Administration's goals for federal spending cutbacks.

The House Ag spending plan includes three WCMA member agricultural policy priorities: support for cost-of-production surveys to inform future FMMO adjustments, an extension of Dairy Margin Coverage to 2031, and an extension of support for certain organic production and market analysis programs.

#### Act Today to Support Dairy Priorities in Wisconsin Budget



As Wisconsin's Joint Finance Committee is poised to take action on the agricultural portion of the state budget in the days ahead, now is the time to <u>act in support of</u> <u>two key industry priorities</u>: funding for the Wisconsin Initiative on Agricultural Exports and Dairy Processor Grants.

#### **FDA Opens Comments for Infant Formula Nutrient Requirements**



The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) is <u>accepting comments now</u> through September 11 to help determine whether existing nutritional requirements for infant formula should be revised based on new scientific data. This is the <u>first</u> <u>comprehensive review</u> of infant formula since 1998, and FDA officials note their effort will include a panel discussion of the topic in June. <u>READ MORE...</u>

#### **FDA Approves Three Color Additives**



The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) on Friday announced the <u>approval of</u> <u>three new color additives</u> for use in the nation's food supply, including: galdieria extract blue, a blue color derived from algae; calcium phosphate, a white color derived from a naturally occurring mineral; and butterfly pea flower extract, a blue color made from dried flower petals. The colors will be approved for use in a range of foods, including yogurt, expanding the "palette of available colors from natural sources for manufacturers to safely use in food," FDA officials said. <u>READ MORE...</u>

As an update to earlier estimates, Dr. Chuck Nicholson of the University of Wisconsin recently published fresh analysis of the economic impact of tariffs on dairy businesses.
