Canada Votes to Cut Dairy Market Access Ahead of USMCA Review



Canadian lawmakers last week approved <u>unprecedented legislation</u> designed to prevent the nation's trade negotiators from reducing tariffs on or increasing import quotas on dairy products, including those from the United States. The provocative move aims to cement Canada's supply management system and protect its own dairy industry ahead of a mandatory 2026 review of the U.S.-Mexico-Canada Agreement (USMCA). <u>READ MORE...</u>

House Appropriations Committee Approves Reduced DBI Funding

Last night, the House Appropriations Committee passed its version of a <u>Fiscal</u> <u>Year 2026 funding bill</u> for the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) and the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) in a party-line vote. The package cuts overall federal support for the agencies by 4.2 percent, or approximately \$1.2 billion, to a total of \$25.5 billion.

The House proposal includes reduced funding of \$8 million for the <u>Dairy Business</u> <u>Innovation Initiatives</u> - a key WCMA priority - funding direct-to-business grants and industry research, education, and technical assistance. WCMA continues to



work with Senate leaders to increase funding from this level in the final package.

The House bill would safeguard the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) from cuts to milk and dairy purchasing, and provides \$4 million for Healthy Fluid Milk Incentives Projects, both provisions supported by WCMA. Also noteworthy is a <u>late amendment</u> to the bill, approved on a voice vote, which would direct USDA to study and recommend to Congress options for reducing market concentration and consolidation in the infant formula industry.

The proposal must now be considered by the full House of Representatives. A Senate proposal is expected in early July.

Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (WDATCP) officials are <u>encouraging dairy processors</u> and other food supply leaders to apply now for Equipment-Only Grants through the <u>Resilient Food Systems Infrastructure</u> (<u>RFSI</u>) <u>Program</u>. Dairy processors and manufacturers operating in Wisconsin are eligible to apply for equipment funding aid if they do not already have an active RFSI grant. Grant proposals must be submitted by 5:00 p.m. (CT) on July 21, 2025. WDATCP will host an <u>informational</u> <u>webinar</u> on Wednesday, June 25 at 11:00 a.m. (CT).


