Trump Announces New Tariffs on EU, Mexico, Canada



Beginning August 1, the United States <u>will</u> <u>impose new tariffs of 30 percent</u> on all goods imported from the European Union (EU) and Mexico, President Trump said on Saturday. The president also <u>announced a</u> <u>new 35 percent tariff</u> on Canadian goods last Thursday, also set to take effect on August 1. Trade officials have <u>threatened</u> <u>countermeasures</u>, but have indicated a willingness to negotiate. Earlier this year, Trump set a goal of 90 trade deals by July 9. White House Rescission Package Raises Concerns for Dairy



A \$9.4 billion rescissions package announced by the Trump Administration last week would roll back funding for several programs, including one with potential impacts for dairy processors. The rescissions include the cancellation of more than \$8 billion for the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID). USAID programs generate an estimated \$2 billion annually in revenue for American agriculture, and several WCMA members are engaged in USAID deliverables. READ MORE...

Senate Committee Proposes Funding for Key Dairy Programs

The U.S. Senate Committee on Appropriations last week unanimously <u>approved its plan for Fiscal</u> <u>Year 2026 funding</u> for the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) and Food and Drug Administration, including monies for Dairy Business Innovation (DBI) Initiatives.



The plan includes support for several important dairy industry programs, including:

- \$223 million for USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service, with \$12 million to be directed to the three original DBI centers, based in Tennessee, Vermont, and Wisconsin.
- \$8.2 billion full funding with no benefits cuts - for the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC), specifically encouraging USDA to preserve allotments of dairy for WIC.
- \$1.2 billion for the Food Safety and Inspection Service, and \$116 million for the State and Local Food Inspections Program.

WCMA is pleased to see these investments to support U.S. dairy, and will continue to advocate on the industry's behalf as the federal appropriations process continues. <u>READ MORE...</u>
