## WCMA, Ag Groups Advocate for Farm Bill Action



As Congress returns this week from its August recess, WCMA and other agricultural groups are again advocating for action on a new Farm Bill. The 2018 package, which includes funding for key dairy processing priorities like nutrition aid and the Dairy Business Innovation Initiative, expired in 2023, and Congress' one-year extension will expire at the end of September.

The Republican-led House Agriculture Committee <u>passed its version of a new farm bill</u> in May, largely along party lines. Democrats who lead the Senate Agriculture Committee have released a <u>detailed summary of their proposal</u>, but no formal bill language. The House and Senate ag committees each draft a version of the farm bill and must reconcile them before a full Congressional vote.

# **U.S. Food Insecurity Continues to Rise**



Hunger remains a concern for a growing number of American families, according to a **new report** from the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA). The report notes that 18 million households struggled with food insecurity in 2023, continuing a multi-year increase. **READ MORE...**


