

30 States Deemed Unaffected in National Milk Testing Strategy



Thirty states have achieved Unaffected Status, also called Gold Status, through the U.S. Department of Agriculture's National Milk Testing Strategy (USDA NMTS) for highly pathogenic avian influenza (H5N1), the agency announced last week. Unaffected Status means no H5N1 has been detected in any of the milk samples collected from that state, and qualifies the state for less-frequent testing, the details of which are still to be defined by USDA. Wisconsin is one of the 30 states that has achieved this Unaffected Status, with no H5N1 detected in more than 14,000 milk samples tested to date.

An additional 12 states are in Provisional Unaffected Status, meaning they are enrolled in the NMTS, but cannot yet be declared Unaffected. One state, Nebraska, moved to Affected Status as it confirmed its <u>first case of H5N1</u> in dairy cattle yesterday. <u>READ MORE...</u>

Second MAHA Report Released

The "Make America Healthy Again" (MAHA) Commission, led by Health and Human



Services Secretary Robert F. Kennedy Jr., last week released its <u>latest report</u>, noting steps the Trump Administration may take to improve children's health and shift food policy. The report aims to build on the <u>first MAHA report</u>, released in May. The new document contains 128 proposals, including 15 that could impact dairy (listed below).

Regulatory/Guidance Recommendations

- Create a first-ever federal definition for ultra-processed foods
- Update the Dietary Guidelines for Americans
- Consider adjustments to proposed Front-of-Pack nutrition labeling rule
- Implement a mandatory "Generally Recognized as Safe" (GRAS) notification program for food additives
- Develop and implement a process for the post-market assessment of chemicals in food, including food additives, color additives, GRAS substances, substances used in contact with food, and chemicals present as unintentional
- Limit or prohibit the use of petroleum-based food dyes (FD&C certified colors) in all food products approved in the U.S.
- Modernize nutrient requirements for infant formula and increase testing for heavy metals and other contaminants
- Reform "outdated and unnecessary food standards of identity that stifle innovation and no longer protect consumer interests"
- Streamline organic certification processes and reduce costs for small farms transitioning to organic

Nutrition Aid Recommendations

- Boost whole milk offerings in schools
- Improve access to healthy foods in schools, prisons, and veteran programs
- Develop "MAHA Boxes" offering additional whole, healthy foods for SNAP recipients

Other Recommendations

- Launch educational campaign to promote new national dietary guidelines
- · Limit advertising "unhealthy" foods to children

There is also a vague recommendation that the federal government "remove barriers preventing small dairy operations from processing and selling their own milk products locally." WCMA will continue to seek additional details on this and other measures, and advocate in WCMA members' interests. The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) has extended the comment period for its proposed agency reorganization plan to September 30. Announced in early August, the plan would relocate staff resources from Washington, D.C. to five regional hubs in Colorado, Indiana, Missouri, North Carolina, and Utah.
