#### WCMA Files Comments on FMMO Recommended Decision



In the final stages of a years-long process, WCMA last week <u>filed comments</u> on the U.S. Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Recommended Decision regarding changes to milk pricing formulas in Federal Milk Marketing Orders (FMMOs). WCMA's comments, submitted by Executive Director John Umhoefer, reiterated the Association's previous recommendation that USDA should rely exclusively on sound industry cost data in its calculation of make allowances, in order to accurately reflect today's higher costs of producing dairy products.

A final decision from USDA, and a dairy producer vote on the order changes, are anticipated before the end of 2024.
