

### **Evers Extends Wisconsin Mask Order to November 21**

This morning, Wisconsin Governor Tony Evers issued <u>Executive Order 90</u> and <u>Emergency Order 1</u>, which together extend the statewide mask mandate by 60 days - or, through November 21.

As with the previous order, which had been set to expire Monday, everyone age 5 and older must wear a face covering when indoors or in enclosed spaces including outdoor bars and restaurants and outdoor park structures. Violations could result in \$200 fines.

Evers' announcement comes as the state is experiencing a sharp rise in COVID-19 infections. Nearly 7,000 new positive tests were reported on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, the most ever in a three-day period in the state.

Republicans who lead the State Legislature have previously expressed opposition to mask mandates, and could vote to lift the order, though they have not called for a special session.

## **CDC Reverses Position on Close Contact Testing**

On Friday, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) reversed its controversial position on coronavirus testing, which previously said that people who didn't have symptoms but were exposed to an infected person "do not necessarily need a test." The CDC <u>website now states</u> said that people without symptoms who have been in close contact with an infected person "need a test." CDC maintains that close contact is defined as within six feet for at least 15 minutes.

# **CDC Delays Vote on Vaccine Rollout**

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has <u>delayed a vote</u> that had been expected today on the rollout plan for initial doses of a coronavirus vaccine, when one is approved. CDC experts generally agree that front-line health care workers should be prioritized, but disagree over the group next in line, with some favoring the elderly and individuals with underlying medical conditions and others favoring essential workers, including those employed in dairy processing.

# USDA Posts Approved Contractors for Third Round of Food Box Program

The U.S. Department of Agriculture has shared a detailed <u>list of approved contractors</u> for the third round of the Farmers to Families Food Box Program, which is expected to deliver \$1 billion in food aid through October 31.

### **USDA Extends WIC Flexibilities**

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) is <u>extending waivers</u> for the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants and Children (WIC), including one which allows participants to substitute milk of any fat content if other varieties are not available.

### **USDA Awards Butter Contracts**

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) has <u>awarded contracts</u> worth \$5.6 million for the purchase of butter from WCMA member Associated Milk Producers, Inc., and two other processors. A complete listing of open USDA solicitations is <u>available online</u>.

## Second Round of CFAP Funding Now Available

On Monday, the U.S. Department of Agriculture launched the second round of the <u>Coronavirus</u> <u>Food Assistance Program</u>, offering an additional \$14 billion in direct relief to agricultural producers facing losses amid the pandemic. The <u>application</u> period is open now through Friday, December 11. # Wisconsin Distributes Extra \$8M in Farm Support

The Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection and Department of Revenue are reporting this week the <u>distribution of \$8.4 million</u> in Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act monies to 3,300 farmers in the second round of the <u>Wisconsin Farm Support Program</u>. In the first round, \$41.6 million was distributed to nearly 12,000 farmers, meaning that the full \$50 million directed by Governor Tony Evers for the program in May has now been expended.

## **FDA Proposes New Traceability Rule**

On Monday, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) announced a <u>proposed rule</u> to establish additional traceability recordkeeping requirements for <u>many foods</u>, including all soft ripened or semi-soft cheeses, and fresh soft cheeses that are made with pasteurized or unpasteurized milk. FDA would also encourage the voluntary adoption of the practices industry-wide.

The <u>proposed rule and draft Food Traceability List</u> will be published in the Federal Register tomorrow, and will remain are available for public comment for 120 days. from the date of publication. The FDA will hold three public meetings during the public comment period, though dates are not yet set. WCMA will keep members informed of relevant developments.
