Government Shutdown Looms as Negotiations Break Down



President Donald Trump today <u>cancelled</u> <u>planned meetings</u> with top Congressional Democrats, a troubling sign that appropriations negotiations have halted in the nation's Capital. If Congress cannot reach agreement over long-term spending plans – or temporary stopgap bills – by September 30, a government shutdown would occur. The Trump Administration has yet to announce federal agencies' contingency plans for how they'd manage operations until Congress approves their funding for the coming fiscal year. <u>READ</u> <u>MORE...</u>

Amid many other priorities, WCMA is leading advocacy efforts to continue funding for the <u>Dairy</u> <u>Business Innovation (DBI) Initiatives</u>, providing both technical assistance and direct-to-business grants across the country. The current House appropriations plan offers \$8 million for DBI programs, while the Senate proposal offers \$12 million.

WCMA Opposing Federal Effort to Define UPFs

WCMA this week <u>submitted comments</u> in the <u>Federal Register</u> in opposition to a government push to define "ultra-processed foods." This comment, drafted with input from many WCMA members, focuses on three key arguments: current regulatory systems already offer consumers clarity; nutritional value, not processing methods, should be the chief consideration in any food classification; and some food processing is essential for safety, quality, and innovation. WCMA is also emphasizing dairy's



tremendous health benefits, proven over decades in scientific studies.

Advocacy Alert: Take Action to Oppose Wisconsin Labeling Bill

On September 22, two Wisconsin lawmakers circulated a bill draft, LRB-2577, that would impose new ingredient disclosure and labeling mandates on food manufacturers. Dairy plants already meet rigorous FDA and USDA standards, and this bill creates a duplicative state-only scheme that would raise costs, mislead consumers, and damage Wisconsin's food economy.

This morning, WCMA sent a strong message to lawmakers in opposition to LRB 2577. Now, we need your voice. If you have any operations in Wisconsin, please contact lawmakers today via WCMA's easy e-advocacy tool and urge them not to sign on to LRB-2577. Tell them Wisconsin should stand for science-based regulation, support for food processors and farmers, and policies that strengthen - not weaken - America's Dairyland. Have questions or concerns? USTR Seeks Comments on USMCA, Foreign Trade Barriers

The Office of the U.S. Trade Representative (USTR) is seeking public comment on the operation of the U.S.-Mexico-Canada Agreement, ahead of a Joint Review on the agreement set for July 2026. Comments are due November 3 by 10:59 p.m. (CT). USTR is also requesting comment on significant foreign trade barriers for its upcoming National Trade Estimate Report. Comments are due Thursday, October 30 by 10:59 p.m. (CT).

Trump H-1B Visa Order Adds \$100K Fee



Effective Sunday, September 21, all new H-1B visa applications are subject to a \$100,000 fee, according to a proclamation issued by the White House last Friday. The proclamation also outlined additional steps to be taken by the Department of Homeland Security and the Department of Labor to revise the H-1B program to prioritize higher-paid, higher-skilled applicants. WCMA is seeking further detail about how the proposal may affect members. Questions may be directed to Rebekah Sweeney.

WCMA Advocates Whey Inclusion in SAF Tax Credit Bill



WCMA is closely tracking Wisconsin Assembly Bill 222/Senate Bill 284, which would create a \$1.50-per-gallon tax credit for the production of sustainable aviation fuel (SAF) made from energy crops grown in the U.S. WCMA is advocating to ensure whey is explicitly recognized as an eligible energy crop. The bill is gaining momentum, with a legislative hearing held on September 16. WCMA will continue working with lawmakers and monitoring the bill's progress to secure whey's inclusion in the final version. READ MORE...

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) has issued solicitations for a variety of cheese products to be used in domestic



food distribution programs:

- <u>Processed Cheese</u> Deadline: September 24, 1:00 p.m. (CT)
- Indefinite Delivery, Indefinite
 Quantity (IDIQ) Process Cheese Deadline: October 6, 1:00 p.m (CT)
- <u>IDIQ Cheddar Cheese</u> Deadline: October 8, 1:00 p.m. (CT)

USDA also released an updated <u>Master Solicitation for Domestic Commodity</u>
<u>Procurements</u>, effective September 18, 2025, which provides general guidance for potential bidders. **READ MORE...**


