Federal Government Shutdown Expected Tonight



The federal government is expected to shut down at 12:01 a.m. Wednesday, October 1, following stalled spending negotiations between Congress and the White House. This shutdown may be different from past government closures, as the Trump Administration is threatening mass firings and a use of the lapse in funding to downsize the federal government. Operational plans amid shutdowns have historically been available for weeks prior to a funding lapse, but many agencies only released their plans in the past 24 hours.

As of the distribution of this newsletter, the <u>U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA)</u> is poised to continue food safety inspections and grading services, certifications, contract procurement and execution, and federal milk marketing orders (FMMOs) during a shutdown. Staffing at the U.S. Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA), <u>Environmental Protection Agency (EPA)</u>, and <u>Food and Drug Administration (FDA)</u> will be reduced, impacting inspections and response times. Payments under the Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) food assistance program <u>could run out of funding this month</u>. Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits <u>could still be sent out as expected in October</u>, as monthly benefits have already been conveyed to states, but November aid is in jeopardy. The school breakfast and lunch programs have limited-term contingency funds, so these nutrition programs would not be immediately impacted by a shutdown.

WCMA Submits Comment on USDA Reorganization

WCMA today submitted comments to USDA on its proposed reorganization. In the <u>letter</u>, drafted with WCMA member input, <u>Senior Director of Programs & Policy Rebekah Sweeney</u> notes that while WCMA supports the goals of fiscal discipline, efficient operations, and continued accountability within USDA, disruption of certain agency services pose a threat to the viability, competitiveness, and growth of our industry.



California Passes Real Food, Healthy Kids Act



On September 16, the California legislature passed the Real Food, Healthy Kids Act, which aims to phase out certain "ultraprocessed foods" from K-12 schools by 2035. The law specifically exempts key dairy products from this definition, including California Class I milk (whole and flavored), infant formula, and yogurt and cheese provided through the USDA Foods for School program. These exemptions ensure that milk, yogurt, and cheese can continue to be part of school meals despite broader product restrictions. Governor Gavin Newsom is expected to either sign the bill or allow it to automatically become law in October, READ MORE...

Advocacy Alert: Take Action to Oppose Wisconsin Labeling Bill



On September 22, two Wisconsin lawmakers circulated a bill draft, <u>LRB-2577</u>, that would impose duplicative, costly new ingredient disclosure and labeling mandates on food manufacturers. The following day, WCMA sent a strong message to lawmakers in opposition to LRB-2577. Since then, WCMA has contacted every Wisconsin legislative office and built a <u>broad coalition</u> <u>of food and agricultural groups</u>, urging lawmakers not to support this bill.

Late last week in Wisconsin, U.S. Immigration & Customs Enforcement (ICE) officers <u>arrested 24</u> <u>people</u> suspected of being in the country illegally. It has been reported that many of them were dairy farm workers, and <u>ICE has said</u> one individual has a history of sexual assault. USDA Awards Processed Cheese Contracts, Updates Master CRD

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) this morning announced it has <u>awarded a contract to WCMA member Bongards Creameries</u> to provide more than 158,000 pounds of processed cheese for use in federal food distribution programs. USDA also said it has updated its <u>Master Commodity Requirements Document (CRD) for Domestic Programs</u>. The new CRD, as well as information on becoming a USDA approved vendor, is <u>available online</u>.
