H5N1 Confirmed in California Dairy Cows

Cows at three dairy farms in California's Central Valley have tested positive for highly pathogenic avian influenza (H5N1), the California Department of Food and Agriculture <u>said late last week</u>. The three farms have been quarantined, and no human cases of H5N1 have been detected in connection with these new positives. Officials reiterated that there remains no threat to the commercial milk supply. **READ MORE...**

USDA Authorizes Field Trial for H5N1 Cattle Vaccine



U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Secretary Tom Vilsack has <u>authorized the</u> <u>first field safety trials</u> of an H5N1 vaccine for dairy cattle. Vilsack said USDA's Center for Veterinary Biologics is overseeing the effort, which is the next step in the process of developing a vaccine that may eventually be widely available to dairy producers.

U.S. Cheese, Whey Exports Show Growth



In 2024, U.S. dairy exports have faced challenges, but cheese and whey sales overseas continue to show growth, according to the U.S. Dairy Export Council (USDEC). Demand for high-quality dairy products, favorable trade agreements, and strategic market diversification have allowed the industry to grow its global footprint.

Mexico continues to be a key growth market for U.S. dairy, with a significant increase in demand for cheese, while Southeast Asia has seen a surge in demand for whey products and lactose.

Butter and cheese are in high demand among consumers in South Korea, supported by the Korea-U.S. Free Trade Agreement, and in the Middle East and North Africa (MENA) region, making these markets top targets for WCMA members looking to expand their reach.

Wisconsin Gains in U.S. Ag Export Rankings

Through the WCMA-championed <u>Wisconsin Initiative for Agricultural Exports (WIAE)</u>, Wisconsin now ranks 11th in the U.S. for agricultural exports, rising from 13th in previous years. Signed into law by Governor Tony Evers in 2021, the WIAE invests \$5 million to help boost Wisconsin agricultural exports by 25 percent by June 2026. <u>LEARN MORE...</u>
