Narcan is a prescription medicine used for the treatment of a known or suspected opioid overdose emergency with signs of breathing problems and severe sleepiness or not being able to respond. Emergency Narcan is easy to administer. It is also available at certain locations without a prescription.





### Steps For the Rescuer:

- Call 911: Tell the operator if the person experiencing the overdose has stopped or slowed breathing.
- 2. Give Naloxone
  - a. Remove any objects from the mouth of the person experiencing the overdose. b. Start rescue breathing: tilt head back, lift chin, pinch nose with other hand, give one breath every five seconds. Continue this for 30 seconds.
  - c. Give naloxone again after 2-3 minutes if there is still no response. More than one dose is sometimes needed.
- 3. Lay person on side: Lay the person on their side to prevent choking. Keep the person awake and breathing.
- 4. **Stay until help arrives:** Stay with the person experiencing the overdose until emergency workers arrive.

# Safe Disposal of Unused Medication: Drop Off Locations

To prevent unused medication from getting into the wrong hands or harming the environment, it is important that you safely dispose of them. Call your local pharmacy to see if they have safe disposal receptacle for public use. Drop off locations for Rock County:
