Speaker: Debbie McKee-Fowler, Chairman of the Board, McKee Foods Corp.

Debbie McKee-Fowler is the original inspiration for the Little Debbie logo and still is very much a part of the family business which was created by her grandfather in 1934. She currently serves as the Chairman of the Board for McKee Foods. Join Little Debbie herself to hear about how her name became an icon in the snack world, what it takes to manage a brand that is so recognizable, the challenges of running a family business and why we just can't get enough of our favorite comfort food.

Since 1934, McKee Foods has operated based on the principles left by O.D. and Ruth which emphasize family values and integrate those values into daily operations. In 1960, the company introduced the Little Debbie brand and ever since, Little Debbie snacks have remained a value leader. McKee Foods was the first bakery to sell individually wrapped cakes in a multipack carton. More than 75 varieties are available. Little Debbie snacks are available in all 50 states, Canada, Mexico and Puerto Rico, as well as on U.S. military bases throughout the world. The top-selling Little Debbie varieties are Oatmeal Creme Pies, Swiss Cake Rolls and Nutty Buddy Wafer Bars. McKee Foods sells more than 200 million cartons of these three products every year. McKee Foods has a manufacturing facility in Stuarts Draft, Virginia.

Gender diversity in apprenticeships is still low, with women making up only 9% of all active federal apprenticeships. Newport News Shipbuilding's Apprentice School has been very intentional in hiring women since the 1970s, and our current enrollment is 14% women, well above the national average.

A panel of current apprentices and their mentors will share why women can be successful in manufacturing apprenticeships. Panelist will share their journeys and the barriers they had to overcome to thrive in a male dominated environment. You will receive tips on hiring and retaining female apprentices, and tools to grow your own female talent pipeline.
