The Montgomery, AL native earned an undergraduate degree in History and Political Science from Troy University and a Master's in History from the University of Hawaii and worked for several years in Washington, D.C. on the legislative staff of a U.S. Senator and a Congressman. Appointed to the County Commission in 2014, Ronda was re-elected unopposed for a second term and voted by her colleagues as Vice Chairman.

Ronda is also a member of the Troy University office of Continuing Education and Outreach where she serves as a certified, professional trainer. In this capacity, Ronda travels all across the state of Alabama speaking and training groups in critical areas such as communication, leadership, and networking.

Ronda's life changed forever at the age of forty-two when she was diagnosed with Stage III breast cancer. She tenaciously honored her commitment and continued to serve with profound impact.
