

Women in Manufacturing Hall of Fame 2024 Nominations Guide

Submission Deadline: June 3, 2024

The Women in Manufacturing Hall of Fame seeks to recognize women who have made, or are making, renowned contributions to the manufacturing industry regarding efforts to support, promote and inspire women in manufacturing. Nominees should currently have (or had, if retired) an established, long-standing career in industry and well documented efforts in support, promoting, and inspiring women in manufacturing.

Since its inception in 2020, 47 trailblazing women in manufacturing have been inducted into the Hall of Fame. Inductees will be honored and celebrated on Sunday, October 6, 2024, at the Women in Manufacturing Hall of Fame Reception during the WiM SUMMIT in Boston, MA.

Inductee Criteria:

- 1. 20+ years of manufacturing industry experience with a portion of that being in an executive or leadership role
- 2. Demonstrated advocacy of women's advancement within their company, industry and/or community
- 3. Has been a spokesperson for manufacturing and the opportunities available for women in the industry
- 4. Displayed history of participation in activities that inspire future women in manufacturing through one or more of the following opportunities: mentoring, panel participation, speaking engagements, and participation in women's organizations

Nomination Selections Process:

The Women in Manufacturing Association (WiM) will be accepting nominations for the Hall of Fame beginning on January 15, 2024, through June 3, 2024. Once nominations are closed, each submission is closely evaluated by a selection panel which includes industry leaders and members of the Women in Manufacturing Association's National Board of Directors. Inductees as well as their nominators will be notified by July 1, 2024 following the selection process.

*Please note: One candidate per company will be selected. With this in mind, we strongly recommend each company arrive at one nomination for submission.
