BARBARA RYNIKER EVANS

President and CEO Con-Tech International



Please tell our readers a little bit about your job and what your work looks like every day. How did you arrive at your current position? What attracted you to a career in manufacturing?

I currently serve as the President and CEO of Con-Tech International, a global part supplier, which I helped my husband found in 1983. I served as outside legal counsel in the years the company grew under my late husband's leadership. When he died after a short battle with pancreatic cancer, I took over the operational responsibilities for the company.

The operational arena at Con-Tech is very different than the advisory capacity in which I served for so many years. My responsibilities range from strategic planning,

financial and personnel oversight and marketing to the maintenance of our warehouses and corporate headquarters.

At WiM, much of our work is dedicated to refuting outdated stereotypes about the manufacturing sector: stereotypes like the workplaces are dirty and dangerous and that the field and skills required are a better fit for men. Have you encountered stereotypes like these in your education or career and how did you overcome them?

Being a female professional was certainly an oddity when I first started to practice law. And there were numerous stereotypes about women lawyers. In fact, the profession itself then was only 10% female. But my law school class was 25% female so the profession was slowly beginning to diversify.

Likewise, female representation in the ranks of the businesses we represented then was equally limited. But the intervening decades have seen the numbers of highly qualified women in all industries grow. And as women typically form strong working relationships with one another, being a woman in business has become an asset today.

You can see these changes in large and small ways. It struck me recently in a meeting with our finance team that all of the people at the table were female, as well as being ethnically and racially diverse. That would never have happened when I started my career.



Research shows that women, especially women in STEM fields, do better if they have a mentor. Has mentorship played any role in your career?

There were no formal mentor relationships in my professional life in the same way that they exist today. My professional development was helped by women and by men. I found that if you are good at your job and committed to excellence, typically that commitment will be recognized by others willing to help you grow.

One of the key findings in WiM's survey is that there is significant overlap between what young women want in careers and the attributes of careers in manufacturing today. But the survey also found that,

too often, young women are not aware of the opportunities available in manufacturing. What do you think can be done to spread the word to women about career options in modern manufacturing?

All professionals need to be aware of their surroundings and attuned to the developments in their workplace and elsewhere. Employers need to be transparent in posting positions through electronic media to their employees and others, and employees need to monitor those postings. Networking, both formal and informal, in the workplace and externally is an ideal way for professionals to become aware of both existing and emerging opportunities. The more involved professionals are in their community and in their workplace, the better informed they will be about job opportunities. We encourage our employees to be active participants in manufacturing events and conferences, professional development workshops, and to share ideas with and support their colleagues. We support all efforts for our team to grow and advance their knowledge and skill sets. We

champion their successes and share those with our customers, colleagues, and supporters.


Our survey also found that the majority of women in manufacturing today would recommend the sector to young women considering career options. Would you recommend a career in manufacturing? And, if so, why?

Please tell our readers a little bit about your job and what your work looks like every day.

My day involves getting the right teams engaged in problem solving, evaluating results to see if their corrective actions have been effective, and providing direction, training and support if items 1 and 2 don't work out. These are done through an evaluation of a variety of standard work reports and status meetings.

How did you arrive at your current position? What attracted you to a career in manufacturing?

I've always done well in math and science and was encouraged early to try whatever would work. In manufacturing, an individual can do much to make a difference. There is so much happening all of the time and no two days are ever the same.

At WiM, much of our work is dedicated to refuting outdated stereotypes about the manufacturing sector: stereotypes like the workplaces are dirty and dangerous and that the field and skills required are a better fit for men. Have you encountered stereotypes like these in your education or career and how did you overcome them?

I don't treat it as a matter of "stereotype" but as a matter of approach. Henry Ford said, "If you think you can or you think you can't, you are absolutely right." When a vision-challenged individual is in my way, I usually work to find common ground on the problem that is being worked on and focus on the situation at hand. We both will usually want the same thing—a fix to the situation. Note that the "fit for men" precept isn't only perpetuated by men, it can be women, too. Or, it can also be cultural.

Research shows that women, especially women in STEM fields, do better if they have a mentor. Has mentorship played any role in your career?

Absolutely. Both men and women. No one is successful alone. Everyone needs supporters and guidance. How well and from whom they accept that guidance and then adapt determines how far they can take things.



One of the key findings in WiM's survey is that there is significant overlap between what young women want in careers and the attributes of careers in manufacturing today. But the survey also found that, too often, young women are not aware of the opportunities available in manufacturing. What do you think can be done to spread the word to women about career options in modern manufacturing?

There are likely three main streams of knowledge that can help make young women more aware of what is

out there: Businesses connecting with the high schools and colleges, students connecting with professional societies (and vice versa), and teachers/professors connecting with the professional societies to create the introductions.

Our survey also found that the majority of women in manufacturing today would recommend the sector to young women considering career options. Would you recommend a career in manufacturing? And, if so, why?

Yes. One can rapidly learn, advance, and be effective in manufacturing. Individuals can be very much in control of how fast they advance, providing that they can get effective results and demonstrate their relevance.

Why did you decide to join Women in Manufacturing? How do you personally find value in WiM membership?

I love the network and the responsiveness of the members when there are questions.
