

Legislative Update - Operating Budget

- \$1M for assistance relating to intimate partner violence (80% rental assistance)
- **\$200,000** study of interjurisdictional coordinating body focused on improving the housing market for tenants, housing providers, and those interested in becoming housing providers.
- \$3.75M for landlord mitigation fund (\$11.75M for the biennium)



- \$400,000 in 2024, \$1,600,000 in 2025 for grants to cities, counties, or nonprofit organizations to support individuals in need of emergency housing assistance.
- \$11.84M for housing assistance, including long-term rental subsidies, permanent supportive housing, and low and no barrier housing beds, for unhoused individuals.
- \$215,000 in 2024 and \$345,000 in 2025 to produce a report to the legislature detailing the scope of work, cost, and timeline to create or procure an online registry of rental units in WA.
- \$16.542M in 2024 and \$17.965M in 2025 for tenant defense in unlawful detainer cases.
